WASBA GALA DINNER / BREEDING AWARDS NIGHT

WESTBRED, FILLIES AND MARES OPPORTUNITIES COMING UP

The three **\$14,999 Heats** for M0 Fillies and Mares are underway, with the \$25,000 final, named after champion Preux Chevalier, being run on 24 October at Gloucester Park. These events are great opportunities for the girls, with the Heat winners only taking a C class penalty. Events have been run for M0, M1 and M2 class fillies and mares and owners have an opportunity to win prize money AND earn valuable EPONA credits.

The \$8,000 Westbred Heats are also underway, with the \$14,999 final being run on. Again, these are ALL only C class penalties.!

Other good opportunities include a **\$10,800** race for C0 fillies and mares at Northam on 16 November, the \$40,000 **Norms Daughter Classic** at Gloucester Park on 21 November, the **Bob Humphries Memorial Westbred Mares Pace** (C2+M0 Mares) on Bunbury Cup night 6 December, and a series of \$14,999 Heats and \$25,000 Final for M1 Mares in December (the \$25,000 Final on Boxing Day).

3YO RACES PROGRAMMED IN OCTOBER TO DECEMBER

If you have a 3yo just about ready to race there are good opportunities in October through to December for these horses. There is one 3yo FILLIES race programmed each WEEK in NOVEMBER and DECEMBER, along with about 30 open 3yo races in November/December. Westbred bonuses and EPONA credits are there to be won.

We are still waiting on some exciting news about improvements to the Westbred Scheme. We will let you know as soon as we hear...

WASBA 2014 STALLION TENDER

Our Stallion Tender has closed. Although we have three good stallions remaining available, we are very pleased with the results. Thank you to all our breeders who put in a Tender and contributed to the success. As always, any proceeds from our fund raising efforts go towards stakes and breeder bonuses for selected races, along with the other breeder/owner rewards that WASBA provides (about 70% of breeders go on to race the horses that they breed).

Over the years WASBA has supported a number of races, with the Golden Girls Mile, the Breeders Stakes and the Daintys Daughter Classic owing their beginnings to WASBA. Our current sponsorship includes three \$14,999 races for M0 C2+ Westbred Mares – the Virgil Queen Celebration Pace at Northam in August, the Bob Humphries Memorial Pace (coming up in December) and the King-Lethbridge Memorial Pace in April.

And thanks and appreciation go to the donating studs in **Alabar** (Grinfromeartoeear and Art Official) **Allwood Stud** (Allamerican Ingot, Cams Fool, Lombo Mandingo and Tinted Cloud), **Empire Stallions** (Modern Art), **Hollywood Park** (Yankee Sensation) **Yirribee** (Lombo Pocket Watch) and **Woodlands Stud** (Highview Tommy).

These are nice stallions (who wouldn't want another Sensational Gabby!) and the more we raise, the more we can do to support breeding and the harness racing industry in WA.

WHAT DID WE BUY?

As part of our continuing efforts to take up opportunities as they occur and provide rewards and incentives to breeders, WASBA has purchased lifetime services to **Elsu** and **Grinfromeartoeear** at very reasonable prices.

We will either use these services as fund raising or as incentives. This year, one of our lucky Tenderers (who otherwise would have just missed out on a great chance) had the opportunity to take up the second Grinfromeartoeear service by matching the accepted Tender price.

A service to Elsu is available this year at a very reasonable price. Elsu was a champion race horse, winning over \$2 million with a best mile rate of 1:53.6. He is from one of New Zealand's very best families. He is the sire of Group 1 winner **Chilli Palmer** 1:51.5 \$227,774, **Remember EI** (4th in the Chariots of Fire) 1:55.3 \$203,932, Stormy Sirocco 1:55.2 \$195,553 and **EI Machine** 1:55.2 \$172,739.

BREEDER OF THE MONTH – August

Congratulations to our **Breeder of the Month Laurie Kennedy**, who bred the 3yo (now 4yo) **Artistic Fella** gelding **Addfueltofire** (out of Darkest Hour by Exotic Earl). Addfueltofire won a 3yo race at Gloucester Park over the sprint distance in an excellent 1:56.5 and followed up with a win in R0 company at Northam a week later.

Darkest Hour, the dam of Addfueltofire, was a winner of 6 races with a best mile rate of 1:57.8. She is from a female line that has produced Albert Terrill 1:58.4 \$313,725, Baylistic Boy 1:58.5 \$167,671 and Come On Frank 1:52.3 \$292,042.

Laurie is our 12th Breeder of the Month winner. Congratulations to the WASBA members who have won a 2013/14 Breeder of the Month Award. WA BASED SIRES – August

In August the progeny of 15 WA based sires produced 26 individual winners of 33 races. **Northern Luck** sired 4 individual winners of 4 races, **Rich and Spoilt** sired 4 winners of 7 races including 2yo gelding Affluent Bell who won a treble and 4yo mare Gota Good Lookadda who won a double. **Allamerican Ingot** also chimed in with 4 winners of 7 races including the 3yo filly Where Dreams Grow who won a treble in the month. Great effort from the youngsters in particular.

Congratulations to the breeders and connections of the 3 WA sired pacers that won 3 races at GP Metro Stakes meetings. The mare Hoylakes Firstlady and the filly Where Dreams Grow are included in the Fillies and Mares section. The other winner was:-

- ❖ **Zacs Nuggett (Parsons Den)** breeder Royalstar Pty Ltd, won a \$18,000 M0-M2 over 2130m in 1:57.3. Zacs Nuggett is a full brother to Sheer Royalty 1:55.7 \$248,954.

Of note is the fact that **Parsons Den** features as the sire of Zacs Nuggett and as the broodmare sire of Where Dreams Grow. Parsons Den has had very limited recent opportunities as a sire, but is showing some class as a broodmare sire.

WESTBRED WINNERS – August

Westbreds won 70 (42.7%) of the 164 races run in the month of August, fairly consistent with the results for August 2013 (41.8%). In percentage terms this is just down on the figures for each of the previous three months, and well down on the 56.1% and 49.3% of March and April. While the result for this month may seem to be ok compared to last year, it's still below what we want to achieve, which is a figure of around 50%. We will be asking RWWA to keep the number of Westbred races up to ensure we can improve the opportunities for our local horses.

There were 16 Westbred races run in August, including the WASBA and Allwood Stud sponsored \$14,999 Virgil Queen Celebration Pace at Northam. This figure is lower than July 2014 and is also lower than August 2013. With both July and August 2014 having lower Westbred races than in 2013 we will be seeking support from the RWWA Handicapper to increase the number of Westbred races in July and August, back at least to the 2013 levels.

Sires (of Westbreds) that did best of the sires based outside of WA were **Grinfromeartoe** (5 winners of 5 races), **Bettors Delight** (4 for 5 races) and **Art Major** (3 for 4) including a double from Major Flirt.

At Gloucester Park Metro stakes meetings 9 individual Westbreds won 10 (20%) of the races. Again, only marginally down on the same month last year but well down on June and July 2014.

Congratulations to the breeders and connections of the 9 Westbreds that won races at Gloucester Park Metro Stakes meetings. One of the winners is mentioned in the WA bases Sires section and three are in the Fillies and Mares section. The other Westbred winners were:

- ❖ **Captain Proud (Riverboat King)**, breeders Barry and Geoff Bennetts, won the Legends Bar Westbred Pathway over 2130m, following on from a third in the 4 and 5yo Manea Classic at Bunbury;
- ❖ **Jasper Freeway (Village Jasper)**, Georgrape Treelopping Services, won the Westralian Series Westbred Pathway following a Bunbury win in a career best time of 1:56.5;
- ❖ **David Hercules (Artesian)**, breeder Steve Johnson, won the \$35000 Howard Porter Memorial FFA over 2536m by 10m, last two quarters in 28.4 and 27.4;
- ❖ **Mako Shadow (Four Starzzz Shark)** breeders MT and D M Schofield and J N Boley, won a Pathway over 2130m taking his season win tally to 5; and
- ❖ **Say It Now (Bettors Delight)** breeders Kevin and Kody Charles, had the rare distinction of winning a double at Gloucester Park, winning a Heat of the Schrader for M1s and the following week won a \$19,000 M1-M3 event.

HOW DID THE FILLIES AND MARES GO (August)

There were 18 fillies/mares races in August, which is equivalent to 11% of the total races for the month. Included in this was the \$14,999 Virgil Queen Celebration Pace at Northam. Fillies and mares won an additional 14 open races (8.5%), meaning that fillies and mares won 19.5% of the 164 races for the month. Of the fillies and mares races, 6 were for 3yo fillies, with the remaining 12 being C, M and R class races. This is the same number of opportunities for mares as in July but well down on June 2014.

The number of fillies/mares races (18) dropped from the 21 held in July 2014 and was 4 less than the August 2013 figure. With the breeding season starting in September it might be an opportunity for more mares' races at this time of year, if the industry will support it. Generally there is a lower horse pool in the winter timeframe, but perhaps this is an opportunity. Let us know what you think.

The Westbred fillies and mares won 20 (11 F/M races and 9 open) races, compared to the August 2013 figure of 27 (12 F/M races and 15 open races). There was only one race restricted to Westbred mares and this was the Allwood Stud/WASBA sponsored Virgil Queen. Again we would like to see the number of opportunities increase for Westbred mares.

At Gloucester Park Friday night meetings 8 Fillies/Mares won 8 metro stakes races, with the NZ mare Salliwod putting in a great effort to win the \$22,500 Garrards Horse & Hound Botra Cup over the Stand marathon journey of 2902m. Congratulations to her connections. Another great effort in the month, other than the winner Libertybell Midfrew, was the effort of Maddy White to run second to this top filly on an extremely heavy track in 1:56.7.

Three of the Friday night winners were Westbred (same as the previous month) and with the return of some nice mares we are hoping for an increase in races won by Westbred mares at Gloucester Park. Congratulations to the connections of the 3 Westbred winners at Gloucester Park metro meetings in August:

- **Harriett Elizabeth (Modern Art)** breeder Steve Johnson; won a \$17,500 3yo race over 2130m
- **Hoylakes Firstlady (Artesian)** breeder Mike Howie, entered the M1 ranks by winning a \$17,500 M0-M1 mares race over 2130m;
- **Where Dreams Grow (Allamerican Ingot)** breeder Royalstar Pty Ltd, winning her third consecutive race with a win in a \$17,500 3yo fillies event.

It's nice to see a 3yo in the list, taking advantage of end of season Westbred bonuses and getting more Epona credits. For her effort at Gloucester Park in winning the 3yo fillies event, Where Dreams Grow won \$1,150 in Epona Credits, \$11,550 in Stakemoney and \$4,250 in Westbred bonus money. Not bad for one race.

A WORD ABOUT EPONA CREDITS

There have been concerns raised that Epona Credits are not worth dollar for dollar. THIS IS NOT THE CASE. Some of the schemes in other States do result in a reduced value but every dollar of your Epona Credit is worth a dollar.

When you pay your stud fee and provide the appropriate documentation to RWWA, you will receive reimbursement, up to the value of your mare's Epona Credits or the Stud fee paid, whichever is the lesser.

As an example, if your mare has 3000 credits but you only paid \$2500 in stud fee, then you can only claim a maximum reimbursement of \$2500. If your mare has 3000 credits and you paid \$4000 in stud fee, then you can claim a reimbursement of up to \$3000. You can claim some, all or none of your credits at any one time and remaining credits do not expire. Epona Credits are earned by winning, are in addition to the winning stake and are equal to 10% of the winning stake. The maximum number of Epona Credits that can be earned is 5000.
