GLOUCESTER STANDARDBRED YEARLING SALE 21 February

The online catalogues will be available in early December for the Sunday 21 February Gloucester Standardbreds Yearling Sale. There will be no race meetings on the day.

A total of 124 entries have been received (71 colts and 53 fillies) with 46 different stallions represented. The leading Australian sires are represented in the Catalogue, along with first crop stallions and other top quality stallions. All but 4 of the yearlings are eligible for the lucrative Westbred Bonus, and 36 yearlings are eligible for the Double Westbred Bonus payment.

WESTBRED, FILLIES AND MARES OPPORTUNITIES COMING UP



2yos - 2yo events start on **4 January**, with 7 races in January and 11 in February.

3yos - The \$25,000 3yo Fillies Sales Classic is on 5 Feb, with the colts event on 19 Feb, 2 days before the Gloucester Standardbreds Yearling Sale.

Plenty of other races for 3yos, from December through to February, including the \$50,000 Daintys Daughter Classic on 12 February

Westbred - Northam has scheduled two \$11,000 races for Westbred C0s, 3 December and 17 December.

Mares - A PBD/Sex race is scheduled for 18 Dec for the M0s

The Coulson Heats for M2 mares start 23 November, with the \$25,000 Final on 18 December;

The \$30,000 Parliamentarians Cup is on 27 November, now only for fillies and mares;

The \$50,000 Norms Daughter Classic is on 4 December

The \$125,000 Mares Classic is on Sunday 13 December, Inter Dominion Grand Final day

The \$50,000 Empress Stakes is on 26 Feb, with lead up races exempting winners from the ballot on 22 Jan, 5, 12 and 19 Feb.

We are hoping for a scratching to get the Busselton Bullet, Smokey The Bandit, into the series. Unfortunately he has been competing in FFA company and has not been able to achieve winning form as have some who have been racing in lower classes and easier company.

We wish the connections of the Irish horse Meadowbranch DJ all the best. It is a monumental effort for him to come to this environment and try to achieve success. Even some of the very best Melbourne Cup contenders have failed in much better circumstances than this horse.

For stallions based outside of WA, PLEASE CHECK, which state the stallion is standing in before you book your mare in. Where a stallion stands will affect the scheme that your foal will be eligible for, and you should check the conditions of the various schemes (like Vicbred and the Queensland and NSW schemes) to ensure that you are getting what you expect.

LINKS TO THE PAST IN THIS YEAR'S BOB HUMPHRIES MEMORIAL

A full field went to the line and it was a keenly run race, with eventual winner 6yo mare **Auctioneers Elsu (Elsu** out of Maybe Matilda by **Hey Maybe**) coming from the rear and flashing down the outside to win the third running of the \$14,999 WASBA Bob Humphries Memorial Westbred Mares Pace. A great result for owner trainer Sarah Suvaljko.

Bred by Dawn Howson, Auctioneers Elsu is out of the mare Maybe Matilda who was the winner of the 1993 WA Oaks. She was driven at various stages of her career by Kim Young and Shannon Suvaljko, so it is uncanny that she is now trained by a Suvaljko (Sarah) and was driven by a Young (Shane).

Amazingly, Maybe Matilda is out of Matilda Trunkey, a mare born in 1979 who was the last foal of Mary Mavis. Matilda Trunkey was one of about 120 horses that Bob Humphries bought across the Nullabor from NSW to WA by train, to his new Trunkey Standardbreds stud. Still one of the biggest movements of horses in our history.

Mary Mavis was good enough to run 3rd in the 1959 New Zealand Oaks, and good enough to compete in the 1963 Inter Dominion at Wayville against Cardigan Bay. She ran third in a heat (to Cardigan Bay) but lost her driver in another heat so didn't qualify for the final. A race fall at the top of the straight in the Grand Final (won

by Cardigan Bay) resulting in the mare Cele carrying two drivers across the line, one of them catapulted from Smokey Eric. Cele is the mother of Trunkey Cele and Celevale Trunkey, another link to Bob Humphries. OTHER MEMORABLE MOMENTS IN NOVEMBER

- ♣ Another exceptional run by Eagle Rox in a 1730m M0 pace for fillies and mares, running in the breeze with a first quarter of 27.1 and a mile rate of 1:55.2, last 2 quarters in 28.6 and 28.2;
- ♣ A top win by The Revolution in a 2130m Pathway by nearly 20m in a mile rate of 1:55.3, last quarters 28.6 and 28.1.

BREEDER OF THE MONTH – October

There were some exceptional winners this month, but with some being previous winners, our *congratulations* this month go to our **Breeder of the Month for October, Ross Torre (Royalstar Pty Ltd)**.

Ross bred 4yo gelding **The Revolution** (Northern Luck out of My Royal Doreen by Jet Laag) who wins the award with 2 wins for the month including a win by 8m at Bunbury over 1609m in 1:54.2. The Revolution has shown huge improvement this year, with this campaign to the end of October resulting in 5 wins, 2 seconds and 1 third from 8 starts. Earlier in the year, The Revolution won the 3yo leg of the WA Sales Classic

Both The Revolution and his dam My Royal Doreen (6 starts for 2 wins and 2 places) were bred by Ross. A half brother to The Revolution was sold at the 2015 Gloucester Standardbreds Yearling Sale for \$17,000.

Congratulations to Ross Torre and The Revolution.

WA BASED SIRES – October

In October the progeny of 13 WA based sires produced 23 individual winners of 26 races. **Northern Luck** had another good month with 6 winners of 7 races. Rich And Spoilt was next best with 4 winners of 4 races. The dual winners were The Revolution (Northern Luck), with Master Jaxon (Cams Fool) and Formyeyesonly (Pacific Fella) again winning a double in the month.

October saw 5 West Sired progeny being winners of 5 races at the metropolitan front meetings at Gloucester Park. Congratulations to the breeders and connections of the West Sired winners:

- ♣ **Tuxedo Tour (Northern Luck)** breeder Royalstar Pty Ltd, brought up his second consecutive win by brilliantly winning a \$23,000 FFA in 1:55.8 last 2 quarters 28 flat;
- ♣ **Maximum Demand (Northern Luck)** breeder T J and K P Egerton-Green and K C Smith, a family effort and showing a definite preference for the stand, won his 2nd race in 4 starts in a \$19,000 discretionary stand over 2503m;
- ♣ **Another Vinnie (Legacy Of Power)** owner/ breeder Les Coulson, won the \$22,500 Dr Pat Cranley Memorial over 1730m in 1:55.5;
- ♣ **Master Jaxon (Cams Fool)** owner/ breeder John Bell followed good recent form with a win in a pathway, then won at Bunbury in 1:58.3, last quarters 28.1 and 27.7; and
- ♣ **Cyclone Mitch (Legacy Of Power)** breeder Les Coulson, won a \$20,000 M0-M2 Pace in 1:57.8.

Northern Luck and Legacy Of Power are both deceased.

WESTBRED WINNERS – October

Westbreds won 71 (37.8%) of the 188 races run in October. This is marginally lower than the previous month, but much lower than October 2014 when there were 86 winners. There were 19 Westbred races run (3 higher than the same month last year). There is strong support from the industry for Westbred races and it is clear that we need to continue to be seeking these races. If your club doesn't run enough, then let them know that you would like to see more.

Of the sires based outside WA, the sires of Westbreds that did best were **Bettors Delight** (5 winners of 7 races), followed by **Elsu** (4 winners of 4 races). Dual winners were Eagle Rox (Bettors Delight), Bettor Reward (Bettors Delight), Vultan Tin (Dawn Ofa New Day), Just Getalifle (Life Sign), Memphis Bomber (Sutter Hanover), and Wetumke (Village Jasper)

At Gloucester Park metropolitan stakes meetings in October, 12 individual Westbreds won 13 (26%) of the races.

Congratulations to the breeders and connections of these 12 Westbreds. Five of the winners are mentioned in the WA bases Sires section and 2 in the Fillies and Mares section. The other Westbred winners were:

- ♣ **Atlatalone (Dawn Ofa New Day)** owner/breeder Ross Waddell, under a new trainer since August, terrific winner by over 14m in a pathway, in 1:56.4 last quarters 28.5 and 27.8;
- ♣ **Baptism Of Fire (Ponder)** breeder Patrician Park, won an \$18,000 M0 in 1:57.8, last quarters 28.1 and 28.9;
- ♣ **Bettor Rules (Bettors Delight)** owner/ breeder A Kay and M Van Rens, ran an impressive 1:55.4 in winning a \$20,500 M0-M2 over 2130m, last quarters 28.9 and 28.6;
- ♣ **Max Meridius (Elsu)** breeders and part owners L and A Stampalia, won an \$18,500 M0, last quarters 28.6 and 28.3; and
- ♣ **Vultan Tin (Dawn Ofa New Day)** breeder, P and D Costello, very consistent since June, won at Gloucester Park early in the month and then won a pathway in 1:58.5, last quarters 28.8 and 28.1.

HOW DID THE FILLIES AND MARES GO (October)

Overall fillies and mares won 39 (20.7%) of the 188 races run in October - 14 (7.4%) of these races were open races and the remaining 25 (13.3%) races were restricted to fillies/mares. There were 23 races open to fillies/mares or mares, and 2 3yo fillies races run. This is an opportune time of year for the late 2yos of last year to get a run and earn some money.

In percentage terms the total number of fillies and mares winning in October 2015 didn't meet our target of 25%, was lower than the previous month and lower than October 2014. Some races on the program did not stand up, in some cases due to high class horses being nominated and in other situations there was a lack of nominations. Particularly with 3yo races, there is still good money to be gained from placings augmented by the Westbred Bonus. We will continue to monitor opportunities for fillies and mares racing, and welcome feedback.

The Westbred fillies and mares won 21 (10 F/M and 11 open) races in October, consistent with the previous months but much lower than October 2014 (27). Narrogin again came to the party with a race restricted to Westbred fillies and/or mares.

The next two months continue to provide improved racing opportunities for fillies and mares, even if they have been served but are still eligible to race. A recent Gloucester Park winner proves that your filly or mare can still have racing success even if they are in foal and will be retired from racing in the near future. They can still collect some stake earnings and Epona Credits, all of which improves their status.

At Gloucester Park Friday metropolitan stakes' meetings, 8 Mares won 11 races, including top class wins by NZ mares Nuala (3 wins including the Heat and Final of the Preux Chevalier), Ideal Alice, Eastwood Crystal, Sovereign Faith, Jungle Jewel and Libertybelle Midfrew.

Congratulations to the connections of all the fillies and mares who won at a metropolitan stakes meeting during October. The winning Westbred mares were:

- ♥ **Eagle Rox (Bettors Delight)** breeder Debra Lewis, along with a phenomenal second to Nuala in the Preux Chevalier Final, she won a Heat of the Preux Chevalier in 1:57, last quarters 28.3 and 27.4, and won a Pathway by over 12m in 1:56.3 last quarters 28.8 and 27.6; and
- ♥ **Just Jamie (Bettors Delight)** breeders Kevin and Annette Charles, won a pathway in 1:56.6, completing 4 wins and 4 seconds in 10 starts.

REVISITING MARES' HANDICAPPING

With the topic brought up by a disgruntled Gloucester Park Harness Racing member at the GPHR AGM (dissatisfaction with mares being given preferential draw in some races in 2014), it is worth revisiting feature races impacted by preferential barrier draw (PBD) on sex.

Here is some history of the races run in 2014 with PBD on Sex, including any 2015 results:

<i>Parliamentarians Cup</i>	started in 1993, has only been won by one mare – Ima Spicey Lombo in 2010. In 2015 it will be restricted to fillies and mares;
<i>Navy Cup</i>	since 1980 has only been won by one mare – Golden Goddess (1998);
<i>Brennan Memorial</i>	won by 3 mares since 1988 - Frith (2015), Leda McNally (2014) and Whitby Heritage (1989);
<i>Stratton Cup</i>	won by 2 mares since 1988 - Sensational Gabby (2014) and Whitby Heritage (1990 and 1989);
<i>Mount Eden Sprint</i>	won by 3 mares since 1980 - Sensational Gabby (2014), Whitbys Miss Penny (1992) and Line On (1986);
<i>(Fremantle) Members Sprint</i>	since inception in 1991 has only been won 3 times by mares - Sensational Gabby (2014) Meggie Dear (2002) and Norms Daughter (1996).

Only the Brennan Memorial produced a mare winner in 2015. Add to this list the 2015 Winter Cup, where Libertybelle Midfrew drew barrier 1 under the PBD conditions, and was unplaced.

The current handicapping model provides for one drop in class for Concession drivers if concessions apply in that race, and an additional class drop for mares racing in "open" races where concessions are permitted.

The following is a comparison of statistics over the last 4 years (2012 had PBD on sex in all open races; 2013 onwards had no PBD in "open" races but an additional class drop. Since September 2014 there has been some PBD/Sex on a limited number of Gloucester Park races):

A shift away from winning open races is expected with more filly/mare specific races, but nevertheless the current system is still a work in progress to improve the percentage of fillies and mares winning races overall.

WASBA believes that breeders and owners need winning opportunities over the racing life of their fillies and mares, which shouldn't just be at 2 and 3. Comprising 50% of the foals, fillies and mares are the future breeding pool and need to have the opportunity of a viable racing career.

We will continue to work with the Handicapper to provide some PBD on sex in some races including some fast class. To date the few races that have been given PBD/Sex have not resulted in a massive swing towards mares winning these events, so criticism is not warranted. Keeping fillies and mares viable helps to keep harness racing viable for all of us, by providing an essential component of the racing pool.

If you have any thoughts on increasing the earning opportunities for fillies and mares, and ensuring the races stand up, please let us know.

THE PREMIER WANTS THE TAB SOLD

If you have attended any of the Ministerial feedback sessions we would like to hear your thoughts. This item may be at the back of the newsletter but is extremely important. It will affect the entire future of WA harness.

We want harness racing and breeding to continue in WA in the best way possible. In WA, WARRG is working hard to inform government about the needs of the industry into the future, under some difficulties. The best thing that can happen is NO SALE. Don't lose sight of this in your deliberations at the ballot box.
