2017 WASBA BOB HUMPHRIES MEMORIAL WESTBRED MARES RACE

It was an excellent night of racing down at Bunbury on Bunbury Cup night, with a good crowd on course and some very exciting racing. The Bunbury Cup was won by Sokys Bigbullet, and Red Hot Roxy returned to racing with an excellent win.

The \$14,000 WASBA Bob Humphries Memorial was an excellent race also, with young Kyle Harper driving forward hard out of barrier 1 in a 34.9 lead time to hold up in front with 4yo mare **Ayana** (Bettors Delight out of Global Image by Armbro Operative). A steady first quarter for a bit of a rest, and solid remaining quarters meant that Ayana had enough left to hold out sprint lane runner Parisian Partygirl and Dior Mia More who flashed down the outside. A good run also by Aqueensomewhere who sat in the breeze after tackling for the front from barrier 2.

Ayana, who is trained by Trevor Wright for owner breeder Bryan Cousins, has shown a lot of improvement this season, with 4 wins and 6 places from 11 starts. Her previous career starts produced only 2 places from 20 starts. Trevor's brother in law John Lowrie was on course to accept the trophy on behalf of the connections and it was fantastic that John was well known to the Humphries family through his role as studmaster for Bob Humphries Trunkey Standardbreds. It was a great catch up.

WASBA is delighted to be involved in these races for the industry and people like Trevor, Bryan and John.

With the backing of the clubs, particularly Bunbury and Northam, WASBA will continue to support our sponsored Westbred Mares races (the Bob Humphries at Bunbury, the Virgil Queen at Northam and the King-Lethbridge).

The new handicapping system will no doubt bring about some changes, but we will be there to provide support for industry participants. We will seek flexibility in the racing system for these mini feature races.

And don't forget the \$25,000 **WASBA Country Oaks Saturday 21 April at Bunbury**. Eligibility for the 2018 Country Oaks will be the same as in 2017, with no restriction on driver.

INTER DOMINION STARTERS

The Inter Dominions is ON! There are 28 starters. Each night will have two Heats with 9 starters, and one Heat with 10 starters. For the first and third nights (at Gloucester Park) there will be a second line for only one Heat. The top ranked Lazarus drew 9 in Heat 1, Lennytheshark barrier 3 in Heat 2 and Chicago Bull barrier 2 in Heat 3, all very competitive heats. There are three WA bred horses in the 2018 Perth Inter Dominion Series: VULTAN TIN (Dawn Ofa New Day), Trainer Phil Costello, barrier 2 in Heat 2; AMERICANBOOTSCOOTA (Allamerican Ingot), trainer Debra Lewis, barrier 4 in Heat 3 and TANAKA EAGLE (Elsu), trainer Reg Phillips barrier 8 Heat 3.

The visiting Inter Dominion horses arrived Sunday with several other horses here for the "minor" feature races. And what an exciting night of racing was Heat Night one!! Brilliant performances by 4yo gelding **Ultimate Machete** (probably the 2018 Inter Dominion winner) to win the \$125,000 4yo Classic by 11.8m in 1:53.8. What a brilliant run by **Handsandwheels** to run second! Kerryn Manning's 6yo mare **Ameretto (Million Dollar Cam)** was also brilliant winning the \$50,000 Norms Daughter Classic from a fast finishing **Ideal Alice** and another of our own, **Sheer Rocknroll** in third. In another one for the girls, **Auctioneers Elsu (Elsu)** finished brilliantly to win Heat 1 of the San Simeon for M1 class in 1:54.3, so heads into the final on Friday week.

As expected, **Lennytheshark (Four Starzz Shark)** and **Chicago Bull (Bettors Delight)** were very good winners of their Heats (**Vultan Tin** was third to Lennytheshark), but **Soho Tribeca (American Ideal)** was even more impressive winning the opening Heat, beating Lazarus by 11.2m with an excellent run by Shandale to finish third.

MICROCHIPPING KITS NOW BEING DESPATCHED

Microchipping has been introduced by Harness Racing Australia for all foals born after 1 September 2017. There is no immediate action required by you as part of the introduction of microchipping, but if your mare has foaled and the foal has been freezebranded, you will be receiving a microchipping/DNA kit.

If you are unsure what to do, contact RWWA Licensing and Registrations on 9445 5558.

Remember, when you register your foal you will have paid for the freezebranding and DNA collection. This does not include the cost of implanting the microchip, which can only be done once the freezebrand is clearly legible.

The microchipping can only be carried out by a vet approved by RWWA to undertake the Collection of Hair Sampling for DNA and Microchipping process. Any vet or veterinary clinic that is not yet approved can contact Mark Kemp at RWWA (email mark.kemp@rwwa.com.au) for an application to Microchip and Collect Hair Samples from Standardbreds. Any Veterinarian registered to practice within WA may apply to be approved.

HOW ARE YOU TRAVELLING?

After 2 months of racing in the new season, \$3.447 million in stakes has been paid out, with an additional amount of more than \$150,000 going back to unallocated funds due to races cancelled or less than full fields running. Without full fields, any system that pays "stakes only" down to last will generally result in less than the full race stakes being paid. In 2016/17 in Victoria and NSW, a combined figure of \$1.4 million in stakes from races run was unspent due to retention of monies from less than full fields.

WASBA has forwarded a proposal to RWWA that would see additional money paid to owners by "reworking" the new system into a stakes and subsidy based system, thereby paying out the full stakes budget to participants, rather than the unspent money being used for other purposes. The proposal would see over 90% of horses equal or better off than under the current system. We are keen to see this considered to assist our participants.

RECENT MEMORABLE MOMENTS

- ♣ Three WA bred (including one Westsired) starters in the Inter Dominions;
- ♣ Brilliant win (and second in a row from the stand) by Tommy Be Good (Jeremes Jet) in the \$30,000 Don Randall Memorial at Pinjarra
- ♣ Cott Beach (Advance Attack) returning to the metropolitan win list with a resounding almost 30m win. Looking good.

BREEDER OF THE MONTH - OCTOBER 2017

There were a number of worthy entrants for Breeder Of The Month but there can only be one winner and this month the award goes to one of WA's big contributors to our sport - **Congratulations** to our **Breeder of the Month** for **October in Bryan Cousins (Tarsao Investments)** who bred the much improved 4yo mare **Ayana (Bettors Delight** out of Global Image by **Armbro Operative**). Ayana won three consecutive races in October - . an R0 at Bunbury by 9m in 1:57.1, a C0-C3 at Wagin by 4m and a C0-C1 at Bunbury. She has gone on to win the WASBA Bob Humphries Memorial in November at Bunbury.

Her dam **Global Image** has produced 3 other winners including **Lamplight Lili (Totally Western)** 1:58.2 \$50,345. Global Image is a full or half sister to 5 winners including **Global Force (Walton Hanover)** 1:57.4 18 wins \$302,685S. This is the same family as 2 from 2 winning 3yo filly **Shez All Rock (Rock N Roll Heaven)** 1:53.7, winner of the 2017 3yo Group 2 Empire Vicbred Platinum Classic

Ayana is trained by Trevor Wright and as mentioned in an earlier article, has gone ahead in leaps and bounds this season. **Congratulations Bryan**, trainer Trevor Wright and **Ayana**.

WA BASED SIRES - OCTOBER 2017

In October 2017, the progeny of 8 WA based sires produced 17 individual winners of 19 races. **Rich And Spoilt** led the way with 5 winners of 6 races, followed by **Allamerican Ingot** with 5 winners of 5 races, **Rich And Spoilt** produced 3 winners of 3 races and **Yankee Sensation** produced 2 winners of 3 races.

There were two dual winners, **Advance Academy** (Advance Attack) and **Leica Spoilt Adda** (Rich And Spoilt).

There were 3 Westsired winners at Gloucester Park Friday meetings in October, including one listed under the fillies and mares section. Congratulations to the breeders and connections of the winners, all of whom won metropolitan stakes races.

- ♣ **Im Batman (Yankee Sensation)** breeders D and R Smith, followed a win in September with a win in an \$18,000 M0 in a lifetime best of 1:56.3 after the leaders ran a 27.9 1st qtr over the 1730m sprint; and
- ♣ **Western Drover (Northern Luck)** owner breeders RJ and J S Bradley, followed a win at Narrogin with a nice win in an \$18,000 M0 in 2:00.3.

WESTBRED WINNERS – October 2017

Westbreds won 84 (40.0%) of the 210 races run in October. While this is up in both number and percentage terms on October 2016, the number of races run was significantly higher (210 compared to 169). This does of course give more horses a chance of winning, which owners would appreciate. Similarly, while the percentage figure is lower than September 2017, the total number is up by 15 (84 versus 69). In percentage terms it's the highest October figure since 2014.

There were 25 Westbred races run in October 2017, which is higher than the previous 3 October figures.

Of the sires based outside WA, **Bettors Delight** was tops with 7 winners of 9 races, followed by **Art Major** and **Mach Three** with 3 winners of 4 races each. **Armbro Operative** and **Courage Under Fire** had 3 individual winners each. There were quite a few sires represented by winners of multiple races, but no other sire with three or more individual winners.

There were 5 dual winners and 1 triple winner this month. Dual winners were – **Major Pocket** (Art Major), **Bountiful Reactor** (Auckland Reactor), **Our Zak Whitby** (Mach Three), **Atmospherical** (Major In Art) and **Thereugo** (McArdle). The triple winners was – **Ayana** (Bettors Delight). All up, there were 53 individual winners for the month, sired by stallions standing outside of WA.

At metropolitan stakes meetings in October there were 13 WA bred horses who won 13 races. This is up on the September figure (10 for 12) but it will probably take a while to get back to the exceptional August figure of 20 individual winners. Congratulations to the breeders and connections of these Westbreds, including 5 listed in the fillies and mares section, and 2 under the Westsired winners. The other 6 Westbred winners were

- ◆ **Addfueltofire (Artistic Fella)** breeder the late Laurie Kennedy, returned to racing after a 9 month break absence and joined the winners list in an \$18,000 M0 to win by 2m, last qtrs. 28.3 and 28.2;
- ◆ **El Hombre (Badlands Hanover)** owner breeder Bob Fowler, started at 25/1 and had to settle for the breeze from barrier 9 but was still too strong and won a \$22,000 M1 to M3 by 3.8m in 1:56.3;
- ◆ **Our Zak Whitby (Mach Three)**, trainer, breeder and part owner Ed Dewar, stepped out a short priced favourite from 2 and led all the way to win a \$20,000 M0-M2 by 5.1m in 1:58.5, last qtr 27.1;
- ◆ **Tanaka Eagle (Elsu)** breeder Total Strategy Pty Ltd, very good odds for an Inters starter, repeated his previous win over this distance when he bolted out of the barrier in a fast lead time of 7.9, was 12m in front with a lap to go and went on to win the \$22,000 M1 to M3 by 3.2m in a lifetime best of 1:54.7;
- ◆ **Thereugo (McArdle)** breeder Donald Harper, started race favourite from 5, raced straight to the front, ran a 27.9 3rd qtr and went on to win the \$8500 Westbred Final by 1.1m in 1:57.2, last qtr 28.7; and
- ◆ **Tommy Be Good (Jeremes Jet)** breeder John Coffey's Patrician Park, started from the 30m mark and followed up his previous 5 wins from stands with a 2.2m win in the \$18,000 M0 and better in 1:58.7.

Stakemoney earned by Westbreds finishing in the first 6 places in all 210 races in October 2017 was \$686,879 (compared to September 2017 \$585,293 from 152 races and August 2017 \$782,564 from 159 races). Total stakes paid to all Westbred starters was \$730,129 out of a total of \$1,850,030.

HOW DID THE FILLIES AND MARES GO (October 2017)

Fillies and mares won 50 (23.8%) of the 210 races run in October 2017. This is a good number of individual races, but we still want to see the percentage stay above 25% for what is effectively 50% of the foals born. In number terms it's the highest figure since May this year, and in percentage terms it's slightly higher than September (23.7%). September and October are often difficult months for fillies and mares, so it is actually good to see that there were 13 more winners this year compared to last year for these two months.

Please let us know if you are having difficulty developing a racing program for your fillies or mares so that we can make representation on your behalf. We look forward to key performance indicators being put in place as part of the strategy for harness, to produce better outcomes for fillies and mares and their owners, which should then lead in to bigger foal crops and better racing opportunities.

Of the wins, 27 (12.9%) were open races and the remaining 23 (11.0%) races were restricted to fillies/mares. The open race wins were seven higher than in September 2017. Overall, two of the wins were by a 3YO filly

(including one in an open 3yo race), 8 were in R class, 19 were in races restricted to C3 and/or lower, and in a very good result, 11 were in M class (including 5 run for C class stakes).

All up, stakemoney earned by fillies and mares finishing in the first 6 places in all races in October was \$406,302 (compared to September was \$321,004 and August \$371,819) with total stakes paid to all fillies and mares for all starters being \$426,462.

WA bred fillies and mares won 44% of the races and earned 49.4% of total stakes won by fillies and mares.

At metro stakes meetings, 10 mares won 11 of the 39 races (28.2%), more than double that of September. Congratulations to the connections of all the fillies and mares who won at these meetings during October.

Winners included NZ mares Donegal Rundlescreek (Bettors Delight) who won a \$20,000 M0-M3 Mares and a \$22,000 M0 and better Mares, The Spinster (American Ideal) won an \$18,000 M0-M1, She Could Be Good (Well Said) won Heat 1 and Millview Sienna (Jeremes Jet) won Heat 2 of the Preux Chevalier for M0 mares, and Foxy Dame (Badlands Hanover) won for the 2nd successive month, this time in a \$22,000 open M1-M3.

The WA bred winners were:

- ♥ **Bethany Aitch (Four Starzz Shark)** breeder and part owner David Young, a nice 2nd two starts earlier followed by a little bit of luck and a good win in an \$18,000 Mares M0 by 2.5m in 1:58.2;
- ♥ **Bettor Boa (Bettors Delight)** owner breeder Trevor and Colleen Lindsay's Karnup Racing, started at very long odds from barrier 7 and surprised the favourite by zipping past her at the 700 to go on and win Heat 1 of the Preux Chevalier by 4m, last qtr 27.1;
- ♥ **Rockin The Boys (Rock N Roll Heaven)**, owner breeder Debra Lewis and Julie champion, 3 wins in September and an excellent win in the C1-C4 Westbred Final after leading, last qtrs. 28.1 and 27.9;
- ♥ **Sarah Goody (Rich And Spoilt)**, owner breeders Rob Hall, Ross Waddell and Kevin Keys, after a surprise loss the previous week proved to be too strong over the finishing stages to win the \$25,000 Preux Chevalier Mares Final by 9.9m in 1:56.4, final quarters in 28.6 and 28.9; and
- ♥ 3yo filly **Tiffany Twirl (Bettors Delight)**, owner breeder Colleen Lindsay, at her 3rd lifetime start, came in to 14/1 in the betting, went straight to the front from barrier 2 and went on to win the \$18,000 3yo Fillies Pace by 1.4m in 1:59.3, last qtr 28.3.

NEW HARNESS RACING COMMITTEE

The new Harness Racing Committee (HRC) will be instituted as a sub-committee of RWWA. As agreed by the Eligible Bodies, membership will comprise of one representative from Gloucester Park, one representative for Country Harness Racing Clubs, one joint representative from Industry Groups (BOTRA, WASBA and HROAWA) and two Independents. The concept has been endorsed by the RWWA Executive and Board and also enjoys the support of the Minister responsible for Racing and Gaming, Paul Papalia, and is to be implemented across all three codes.

The Committee is being formed to make recommendations on strategy, policy direction etc to the RWWA Board for endorsement. The HRC members will need to consult with the Eligible Bodies as part of this process, and the Eligible Bodies will have the opportunity to put forward strategic and policy initiatives to the HRC.

The chair of the HRC will be the Harness Code Director (Bob Fowler). Committee members must be ratified by the RWWA Board before they commence their duties. A minimum of 3 Committee members plus the Chair must be approved before any meetings can take place. Two independent members for the Committee will be selected through application and interview by the 3 HRC members once they commence in their roles.

Two Committee members have been nominated to date - the GPHR nomination is Michael Radley and the country clubs have nominated Peter Trefort.

The Industry Group nominee was put forward to RWWA earlier this month by agreement between the then BOTRA President and the WASBA and HROAWA Presidents. Under their new Executive team, the BOTRA Committee has requested the nomination be revisited.

In the meantime, RWWA will continue to manage harness under the current processes.

FUTURE OF THE INTER DOMINIONS

There have been some recent announcements from HRA and HRV about the next decade of Inter Dominions. The Victorian release gives the impression that the next 9 Inter Dominions will take place on the eastern seaboard and in NZ. A careful reading of the HRA release is not as emphatic. To quote from the HRA release:

In an agreement between the co-hosts and IDEC, the rotations proposal will be evaluated in terms of prizemoney, format and the addition of other eligible members into future rotations following the second year of each rotation phase.

Inter Dominion Event Committee (IDEC) Chairman, Mr Ken Spicer was also quoted:

".....The co-hosts have developed a unique proposal which delivers certainty for this iconic event for at least the next nine years, and beyond if other eligible bodies join the cycle in the second and third rotation phases,"

In other words, WA will still be able to be included in the Inter Dominion rotation should a suitable proposal be put forward by WA after the 2019 Inter Dominion Series.
