DATES FOR THE 2018 WA 2YO AND 3YO SALES CLASSICS

The dates for the 2YO Sales Classics are significantly earlier this year. The earlier timeslot was chosen to better align with the Sale date and allow vendors and purchasers to view the talent from last year's Sale. Both the 2yo and 3yo Finals (which are one week after the 2YO Finals) and the Sale will be held within an 8 day period.

The Heats of the 2YO WA SALES CLASSICS are scheduled for Tuesday 20 February 2018. **The \$100,000 2YO Finals** will be run **Friday 2 March 2018**, with the 2018 APG Sale on the following **Sunday 4 March 2018**.

2yo Trials are scheduled from 1 November 2017. Please be aware that the Trials for Byford, Pinjarra, Bunbury may be scheduled less often. Contact the relevant clubs or RWWA to confirm the trial schedule.

2YO, 3YO, FILLIES, MARES and WESTBRED OPPORTUNITIES COMING UP

Mares -	Please take note: the \$14,000 WASBA Bob Humphries Memorial will now be run on Bunbury Cup night, Saturday 18 November; The \$30,000 Parliamentarians Cup is on 1 December;
Westbred	races continue to be programmed. At this stage the (previous) \$8500 Westbred Heats (including M0) and \$14,999 Finals are being run as \$7,000 Heats and \$8500 Finals; WASBA is again supporting the Busselton Sweetheart Series this year. The breeder of the highest point scoring Westbred mare will receive \$500 cash from WASBA, and the mare will receive \$500 in breeding credits.



RWWA WORKSHOPS SCHEDULED FOR NOVEMBER

Did you receive an email from RWWA concerning the Industry Workshops which are scheduled for 16 to 26 November at Bunbury, Byford, Narrogin, Pinjarra, Wanneroo and at the RWWA Osborne Park office?

RWWA are now seeking Industry input and feedback on the draft model of their new approach to scheduling meetings, programming and handicapping horses. The new model is designed to provide more competitive racing and provide owners and trainers with greater opportunities to place their horses where they believe they have the greatest opportunity to earn.

WASBA COUNTRY OAKS AND MARES RACES THIS SEASON

With the backing of the clubs concerned, particularly Bunbury and Northam, WASBA is continuing to support our sponsored Westbred M0 Mares races (the Bob Humphries at Bunbury, the Virgil Queen at Northam and the King-Lethbridge).

The changes introduced on 1 September to stakes, programming and club funding resulted in limitations on the stakes level for these and other small feature races. Following further discussion with RWWA, we are pleased that RWWA has agreed to a stakes level of \$14,000 for the WASBA races. We are continuing to seek more flexibility in the program model for these and other mini feature races.

On a high note, the **WASBA Country Oaks** will be a **\$25,000 Listed race** run Saturday **21 April** at **Bunbury**. Eligibility for the 2018 Country Oaks will be the same as in 2017, with no restriction on driver.

INTER DOMINION THIRD RANKINGS

Following payment of first acceptances and the release of 3RD Rankings the contenders for the last of the Perth Inter Dominions are being finalised. There have been minimal moves at the top end with Lazarus, Lennytheshark, Chicago Bull and Our Dream About Me remaining in the first 4 positions. Other horses currently in WA that are ranked in the top 10 are Ohoka Punter, Shandale (originally ranked 29) and Soho Tribeca. Devendra remains in the list (13), and there are now three WA bred horses with a good chance of starting:

MICROCHIPPING PROCESS

You should have recently received a letter in the mail from RWWA detailing the new microchipping process for WA. Microchipping has been introduced by Harness Racing Australia for all foals born after 1 September 2017. There is no immediate action required by you as part of the introduction of microchipping, but if you have not received the letter, or are unsure what to do, contact RWWA Licensing and Registrations on 9445 5558.

When you register your foal, the registration fee includes the freezebranding and DNA component, but not microchipping, which can only be done once the freezebrand is clearly legible.

The microchipping can only be carried out by a vet approved by RWWA to undertake the Collection of Hair Sampling for DNA and Microchipping process. Any vet or veterinary clinic that is not yet approved can contact Mark Kemp at RWWA (email mark.kemp@rwwa.com.au) for an application to Microchip and Collect Hair Samples from Standardbreds. Any Veterinarian registered to practice within WA may apply to be approved.

RECENT MEMORABLE MOMENTS

- ♣ Excellent run by Westsired Inters contender **Americanbootscoota** (Allamerican Ingot) to set the pace and run second to Chicago Bull in the Navy Cup in 1:53.5, with 4 Inter Dominion runners behind him;
- ♣ Westbred filly **Nostra Villa** (Art Major) was announced winner of the Lawn Derby Australian 2yo Filly of the Year with 8 wins from 9 starts including the \$285,000 Breeders Crown 2yo Fillies Final; and
- ♣ Recognition for our WA bred horses in the RWWA Harness Horse of the Year Awards. Westsired filly **Cott Beach** (Advance Attack) won 2yo Filly of the Year, and Westbred gelding **Handsandwheels** (Mach Three) won 3yo Colt/Gelding of the Year.

BREEDER OF THE MONTH – SEPTEMBER 2017

It was all the 4yos vying for our award this month, with several excellent performances. **Congratulations** to our **Breeder of the Month** for **September Debra Lewis**, who bred 4yo mare **Rockin The Boys (Rock N Roll Heaven)** out of Boys Lie by **Badlands Hanover**. Rockin The Boys won three consecutive races in September, including a \$7,000 M0-M2 and a Heat of the Westbred C1-C4. She has since gone on to win the \$8,500 Final.

Rockin The Boys did not race until a 3yo, with her first start in February this year. She has now won over \$52,000 from 9 wins and 9 places. She is the first foal from her dam **Boys Lie**, who is a half sister to 5 other winners including **Kiss Chasey (Yankee Sensation)** 1:55.3 16 wins \$146,358, and **Play The Boys (Shadow Play)** 1:56.2 \$64,550 who won a Heat and Final of the WA Sales Classic at his only 2 starts.

Debra is going great guns as a trainer, with Americanbootscoota and Virgil Queen winner Sea Me Smile also being prepared by Debra.

Congratulations Debra Lewis and Rockin The Boys.

WA BASED SIRES – SEPTEMBER 2017

In September 2017, the progeny of 8 WA based sires produced 16 individual winners of 18 races. **Allamerican Ingot** produced 5 winners of 6 races, **Rich And Spoilt** produced 3 winners of 3 races and **Yankee Sensation** produced 2 winners of 3 races.

There were three dual winners, **Spock The Spaceman** (Allamerican Ingot) and for the second successive month, **Susie Rocks** (Yankee Sensation).

There were 2 West-Sired winners at Gloucester Park Friday meetings in September. Congratulations to the breeders and connections of the winners.

- ♣ 9yo gelding **Dredlock Rockstar (Northern Luck)** breeder Royalstar Pty Ltd, returned to the winners list in a \$20,000 M2 class in 1:56.6 after being last early and making a good run at the 1200m. Top class final qtrs of 27.7 and 28.3 and career stakes over \$200,000; and
- ♣ **Glow Bright (Artesian)** owner breeder Elderbell Holdings Pty Ltd, one out one back after a midfield scrimmage and made the most of it to win the reduced stakes M0-M2 by 2.4m in 1:56.2, last qtrs. 28.6 and 28.8. Now over \$156,000 in stakes.

WESTBRED WINNERS – September 2017

Westbreds won 69 (45.4%) of the 152 races run in September. While this is down on the August peak of 57.2%, it is much higher than September 2016 (36.4%) and is higher than the September figure for the previous 3 years. September and October are traditionally low for us, so although lower than our 50% target it is a better than our usual result. We hope that the new dynamic programming is providing the right opportunities and rely on you letting us know if this is not the case.

There were 25 Westbred races run in September 2017, which is higher than the previous 3 September figures.

Of the sires based outside WA, **Bettors Delight** led with 4 winners of 6 races. There were quite a few sires represented by winners of multiple races, but no other sire with three or more individual winners.

There were 6 dual winners and 4 triple winners this month. Dual winners were – **Baylan Jett** (Courage Under Fire), **Our Zak Whitby** (Mach Three), **Thereugo** (McArdle), **Abraxas Blues** (Santanna Blue Chip), **All Over Tan** (Somebeachsomewhere) and **Jasper Casper** (Village Jasper). Triple winners were - **Chiaroscuro** (Art Major), **Dodolicious** (Bettors Delight), **Tyler Brett** (Robin Hood) and **Rockin The Boys** (Rock N Roll Heaven). All up, there were 53 individual winners for the month.

At metropolitan stakes meetings in September there were 10 WA bred horses who won 12 races. Not surprisingly this is lower than the phenomenal figure for August, but it is still a reasonable month. Congratulations to the breeders and connections of these Westbreds, including 1 listed in the fillies and mares section, and 2 under the Westsired winners. The other 7 Westbred winners were

- ◆ **Abraxas Blues (Santanna Blue Chip)** breeders Deb Prentice, P Kennedy, Mark Conlan, G Chappell and C Berryman, raced behind the leader before zipping out wide and grabbing a win on the line in the \$20,000 M0-M2 in 1:55.5 over the 1730m, last qtrs 28.5 and 27.7;
- ◆ **Argyle Red (Dawn Ofa New Day)**, owner/breeders Rob and Ann MacDonald, led and won a \$22,000 M1-M3 over 2130m by 3m in 1:57.7;
- ◆ **Bettor Not Bitter (Bettors Delight)** breeder Greg Bond, Rob and J Gartrell, A Foster and C Hampson, 4 wins in July and August then raced 3 wide and breezed to win an \$18,000 M0 by 5m;
- ◆ **Heez On Fire (Courage Under Fire)** breeder Total Strategy Pty Ltd, first ever race start in a stand and stepped off perfectly from 30m to win an \$18,000 M0 and better over 2503m by 1.1m in a tick over 2:00, last qtrs 28.4 and 28.5. Approaching \$300,000 in stakes;
- ◆ **Mako Shadow (Four Starzzz Shark)** breeders M and D Schofield and J Boley, led and won an \$18,000 M0 in 1:56.3 over 1730m, now just short of \$100,000 in stakes;
- ◆ talented and very consistent 4yo **Our Zak Whitby (Mach Three)**, breeder and part owner Ed Dewar, won a C2 at Pinjarra by over 18m then led and won an \$18,000 M0 by 9m, last qtrs 27.4 and 28.8; and
- ◆ **Thereugo (McArdle)** breeder Donald Harper, very classy double in successive weeks with a win in a C5-C9 in 1:56 flat then another win in C5-C9 company after zooming to the front, rating 1:57.

Although Heez On Fire withdrew from the Inters, he will still be competing in some of the top level events.

Stakemoney earned by Westbreds finishing in the first 6 places in all 152 races in September 2017 was \$585,293 (compared to August 2017 of \$782,564 from 159 races) with total stakes paid to all Westbred starters being \$623,813 out of a total of \$1,596,540. The stakes payout for these races would have been \$1,613,000 (plus travel subsidy) but with the payment from stakemoney alone down to 12th for all starters commencing from 1 September, the lower payouts are to be expected while field sizes are less than 12.

HOW DID THE FILLIES AND MARES GO (September 2017)

Fillies and mares won 36 (23.7%) of the 152 races run in September 2017. While this is lower than recent months, in percentage terms it is higher than the same month for the last three years. This does offer some encouragement, with September and October often being a challenge and a change in careers for some mares heading towards breeding careers. We would still like to see our target 25% being met with the continuation of racing opportunities for those fillies and mares that are remaining in the racing system.

With the new dynamic race program in place, please let us know if you are having difficulty developing a racing program for your fillies or mares so that we can make representation on your behalf. We would like see strategies in place that produce better outcomes for fillies and mares and their owners.

Of the wins, 20 (13.2%) were open races and the remaining 16 (10.5%) races were restricted to fillies/mares. The open race wins is consistent with last month and higher than September 2016 and 2015. Overall, three of the wins were by 3yo fillies, 13 were in races restricted to C2 and/or lower, 2 were R class and in a very good result, 8 were in M class (3 of these wins were at midweek meetings for stakes of \$7,000, not M class stakes).

All up, stakemoney earned by fillies and mares finishing in the first 6 places in all races in September was \$321,004 (compared to the August 2017 figure of \$371,819) with total stakes paid to all fillies and mares for all starters being \$339,864. The lower figures are expected, with stakes now being paid down to 12 and therefore full payout of stakes does not occur unless there is a full field of 12.

WA bred fillies and mares won 61.1% of the races and earned 56.4% of total stakes won by fillies and mares.

At metropolitan stakes meetings, 5 mares won 6 of the 47 races (12.8%). The results for July to September this year have been lower than in 2016.

Congratulations to the connections of all the fillies and mares who won at these meetings during September.

Winners included NZ mares Maia Maguire (Bettors Delight) who won an \$18,000 Mares M0, Shes Turbo Charged (Santanna Blue Chip) won an \$18,000 open M0, Shes Artful (Art Major) won an \$18,000 M0-M1 and Foxy Dame won a \$20,000 Mares M0-M2.

The WA bred winner was:

- ♥ ***Dodolicious (Bettors Delight)***, bred by Greg and now owned and trained by Skye Bond, made it 3 out of 3 after a 3 month break, winning a \$20,000 Mares M0 to M4 by 4.5m in 1:57.6 after her two previous wins in C5 to C9 company. Her stakes are now \$465,960 (plus Westbred bonuses) from her 31 starts which includes multiple Group 1s in her 18 wins.

NEW CONSULTATIVE SUB COMMITTEE

RWWA has instituted a new Harness Consultative Committee (HC). The concept has been endorsed by the RWWA Executive and Board and also enjoys the support of the Minister responsible for Racing and Gaming, Paul Papalia, and is to be implemented across all three codes.

At a special meeting of the Eligible Bodies, the majority decision supported the HC membership consisting of one representative put forward by GPHR, one representative from the country clubs, one representative for participants (covering Owners, Breeders, Drivers and Trainers) and 2 independent committee members.

The chair of the HC will be the Harness Code Director (Bob Fowler). WASBA, BOTRA and HROWA are required to provide their joint nominee for RWWA Board approval by 20 November 2017.

The expectation from the RWWA Board is that these Committee's will agree on strategy, policy direction etc and make recommendations to the RWWA Board for endorsement. The HC members will need to consult with the Eligible Bodies as part of this process, and the Eligible Bodies will have the opportunity to put forward strategic and policy initiatives to the HC.
