2018 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING (AGM)

The 2018 WASBA AGM was held on Friday 27 April at *Gloucester Park*.

Holding an AGM is part of every association's legal responsibility under the *Associations Incorporation Act 2015* (this Act came into effect on 1 July 2016 and replaced the *Associations Incorporation Act 1987*). The Act requires the annual financial accounts for the (association's) preceding financial year to be presented to members at each AGM. Whilst it is not mandatory under the Act, WASBA's financial accounts are audited every year.

Apart from presenting the annual accounts, the AGM also provides the opportunity for us to reflect on achievements and issues through the Presidents Report, and allows members to ask questions and provide comment.

Thanks to everyone who attended. We would always like to see more of our members at the AGM, giving greater opportunity to present views and discuss various topics in an open forum. This assists us in running WASBA better and doing more for you.

As a result of the AGM our new Auditor will be Garry Scott. Returning Committee members for two years are Jeanine Diederich, Howard King, Graham Compson and John Coffey.

PINJARRA GOLDEN GIRLS CLASSIC

Another top class field stepped out this year in the \$30,000 Global Breeding Farms Golden Girls Mile and for the second year running it was a super race by Major Reality (Art Major) to take the spoils. No luck this year for Chris Voak, with Gary Hall Jnr being fit to drive after Chris got the winning drive last year when Gary became ill during the meeting.

Last year she sat in the breeze most of the race but this year, after starting from barrier 8, Major Reality was in 5th position, running 3rd on the rails. With 400 to go she was 7th and still bailed up on the fence. Just after the 400 Justin managed to weave her off the rails and running 6 wide down the straight she powered home to grab the win on the line, running 1:54.7 with last quarters 27.4 and 28.3.

Congratulation to the connections, trainer Justin Prentice, driver Gary Jnr, Pinjarra Harness Racing and race sponsor, Mike Hackett's Global Breeding Farms.

WESTBRED 4 AND 5YO MARES SERIES

Our life member Laurie Kennedy has been honoured by Gannons with the Race For Roses (run on Oaks night), named after Laurie. Any filly or mare can run in this race and it is a standing start, and therefore handicap race. What a great race it was the other night, with the win going to the Colin Brown trained and driven Eden Franco, racing in superlative form for Jim Currie and her other owners.

WE ALSO HAVE the Laurie Kennedy 4 and 5yo Westbred mares series, a series initiated by WASBA, specifically for those mares who have not won a race of \$25,000 or more.

The first heat has been run, with success going to Susie Rocks from Rockin the Boys, Chelsea Royale and Liberte. These 4 mares have qualified for the Final. The remaining heat is at Narrogin (26th May), with the \$25,000 Final at Gloucester Park on Friday 1 June. If your mare is eligible, it's a good opportunity for her to earn some nice money and Epona Credits and a Listed race credit against her name. If any heats are not run (as is the case with Heat 2 that was scheduled for Bunbury) the final field is selected from the successful heat runners, with any remaining places filled by mares that nominated for Heats.

Laurie was a life member of WASBA, making significant contributions over a long period of time, as well as the significant time and effort he put into the WA Yearling Sales in the development days.

The inaugural 4/5yo Mares series was run in 2016 and produced a win for Bettors Gem, with Sheer Rocknroll winning the 2017 series.

The **open Kerry Clarke 4 and 5yo Series with \$25,000 Final will be run in July/August**, with all 4 and 5yo Westbreds who have never won a race worth \$25,000 or more, eligible to compete.

WASBA KING-LETHBRIDGE MEMORIAL

What a great day at Pinjarra on 30 April for the running of the \$14,000 WASBA/Allwood Stud King-Lethbridge Memorial for the Westbred M0 Mares. A good start to the day with the Allwood Stud 2yo event won by a very promising 2yo Westbred gelding in Bitcoin, bred and owned by Greg Bond and stable clients and out of the outstanding mare Am Opulent. Overall, 7 of the 9 events were won by Westbreds.

Great drive by Shannon Suvaljko to rocket out from 5 to get the lead and then concede that position to Chris Lewis on Susie Rocks. In a solidly run race, Soho Changeling was able to head for the sprint lane down the home straight and get past Susie Rocks to win by 1.6m in 1:57.4, last quarters very fast at 28.3 and 27.8. Congratulations to Larry and Steve Nelligan, trainer Ross Olivieri and driver Shannon.

WASBA puts \$3,000 into the stakes for this race to give the M0 girls a chance to earn some nice money. We appreciate Allwood Stud also supporting this race to take the stakes to \$14,000. This race is named in honour of the late Chris King-Lethbridge for his tremendous support of country harness racing and the former Harvey Trotting Club. We thank Pinjarra for supporting this race and in doing so, supporting our WA bred mares, ensuring they have quality racing and winning opportunities.

THE WESTBRED AND EPONA REVIEW

Following on from the Handicapping Review (did you provide feedback? – if you didn't but still want to, call the RWWA office or email harness.information@rwwa.com.au) – some of you may have participated in the Westbred Review.

This is still underway, with further feedback to be requested soon by RWWA. However, early indications are that there will be some positive outcomes from the review. Stay tuned.

The PROPOSED POINT OF CONSUMPTION TAX and the WA TAB

We have not had any involvement in Phase 1 of the governments consultation process regarding the future of the WA TAB. A decision is expected soon. Depending on that outcome, the Government has stated that if they consider it is in the best interests of the State and the industry to pursue a sale, as part of Phase 2 of the process they will release a discussion paper for public comment, which would then give an opportunity for all to provide input.

It is important that any decision is in the best interests of harness. However, regardless of that decision, the proposed Point of Consumption Tax will also impact the racing codes.

The Harness Racing Committee (HRC) has provided a response to Department of Treasury on the Point of Consumption Wagering Tax and suggested the level of compensation that is required.

There is currently a wide disparity between what the WA Government considers is reasonable compensation to the racing industry and what the HRC and other components of the racing industry have suggested. The HRC has also requested the WA Government delivers wagering tax parity with racing industries in other states (the WA racing industry pays the highest level of taxation).

As this matter progresses, we will provide information for you to write to or lobby your local members of parliament, so that they can put forward your views when considering the right level of entitlement.

RECENT MEMORABLE MOMENTS

- ♣ Global Breeding Farms Golden Girls Mile won by Major Reality (half sister to Ultimate Machete);
- ♣ Fantastic WA Oaks, with two of the top 4 finishers being Westsired.
- ♣ Along with excellent results for Colin Brown in the Sales Classic, and Easter Cup, Colin is still going strong with a top win in the Laurie Kennedy Race For Roses with Eden Franco. We will be proposing that this race revert to \$35,000 in stakes for next season;
- ♣ Top WASBA Breeders Stakes, a Group 2 event this year, brilliantly won by Maczaffair.

BREEDER OF THE MONTH – MARCH 2018

The Breeder of the Month award goes to a different WA bred horse each month. Previous winners are not eligible for later awards. The Award is the only Breeding Award provided by WASBA that is restricted to WASBA members.

A very tight go again this month but in the end it's *congratulations* to our **Breeder of the Month** for **March, Ed Dewar** for breeding 2yo gelding **Its Rock And Roll (A Rocknroll Dance** out of Miss Worthy Whitby by **Bettors Delight**).

Its Rock And Roll won at his first race start, ran second in a heat of the Sales Classic and at his third race start won the \$100,000 Sales Classic Final in a sterling finish. Well driven from barrier 7, Its Rock And Roll settled in the one-one. With the race run in solid quarters, it was an exciting contest down the home straight to the finish with Its Rock And Roll prevailing over the race leader by a head in 1:56.6 for the 1730m.

Ed Dewar is responsible for bringing the Remit maternal line to WA and **Miss Worthy Whitby** is another "outside" mare that Ed has invested in, buying her for \$26,500 at the 2009 Victorian Yearling Sale. She raced 14 times for 3 wins and 3 seconds, for \$40,154 and a very modest winning mile rate of 1:59.9. She is entirely US bred being out of the imported Artsplace mare **Spirited Storm**. Miss Worthy Whitby is the first foal of her dam, who now has 5 winners including her 2013 foal the unbeaten **The Storm Inside (Rocknroll Hanover)** 1:54.6 7 wins \$222,845. Spirited Storm comes from one of the best maternal lines (**Blue Horizon**) in harness racing.

Its Rock And Roll is the second foal from Miss Worthy Whitby, and first winner. He is from the first Australasian crop of A Rocknroll Dance (Rocknroll Hanover) 1:47.4 \$2,441,164.

Congratulations Ed Dewar, Its Rock And Roll and his connections, and trainer driver **Colin Brown**.

WA BASED SIRES – MARCH 2018

In March 2018, the progeny of 13 WA based sires produced 19 individual winners of 20 races. **Allamerican Ingot** and **Advance Attack** each had 3 individual winners. The dual winner for the month was **Its My Lucknow** (Yankee Sensation).

There were two Westsired winners at Gloucester Park metropolitan stakes meetings in March.

- ♣ **Trustytrev (Franco Terminator)** owner breeders N, L and Cameron Mills, restrained from 9 and a good drive to grab a forward rails position, getting clear in the back straight to win an \$18,000 M0 by 7.5m in 1:58.3 to take his career stakes to a handy \$80,000 plus; and
- ♣ **Glow Bright (Artesian)** owner breeder Elderbell Holdings, started at nearly 50/1, driven faultlessly to race home then hold off a very late challenge to win a C5 to C9 Westbred in 1:58.3.

Another reminder for your 2yo or 3yo Westsired runner – the 2 and 3yo Westsired Classics will be run as separate \$25,000 races for fillies and colts/geldings if there are sufficient acceptors. If there are insufficient acceptors to run the separate races they will again be run as a single race for that age group with stakes of \$30,000, with pref draw on sex.

*** *The **3yo Westsired Classic/s** will be run on **15 June 2018**. The **2yo Westsired Classic/s** are scheduled for **22 June**. **Both** will give you the opportunity to run in the relevant Westbred Classic.*

WESTBRED WINNERS – MARCH 2018



Westbreds won 101 (50.0%) of the 202 races run in March 2018. This sits right on our target of 50% Westbred winners per month, and is the highest figure in percentage terms for the same month since 2014 (56.1%). March 2014 is also the last time that the March figure exceeded the February figure.

There were 27 Westbred races run in March 2018, the same as the previous month. Maintaining these Westbred races is very important in achieving our monthly targets. We will continue to review the number of Westbred winners in the 2 and 3yo category to ensure a balance between number of starters and number of winners, with Westbreds making up the majority of runners in the 2 and 3yo age groups. The purpose of the Westbred only races is to ensure enough Westbred progeny can win and have the right racing opportunities. Other states are starting to look at these techniques to sure up their racing and breeding numbers. We welcome runners from elsewhere, but want to achieve the right balance of success.

Of the sires based outside WA, an unusual result this month with **Major In Art** leading with 5 winners of 7 races and **Jeremes Jet** next with 6 winners of 6 races. **Bettors Delight** and **Mach Three** followed, both with 4 winners of 5 races. Including the WA based sires, there was a total of 50 sires represented,

There were 9 multiple winners for the month from sires bases outside of WA. Dual winners were **Khun Ratha** (Bettors Delight), **Armbro Bliss** (Blissfull Hall), **Courage To Live** (Courage Under Fire), **All About The Cash** (Gotta Go Collect); **Lord Willoughby** (Mach Three) for the THIRD consecutive month; **All The Whispers** and **Amity Piere** (Major In Art); and **Debt Free Charlie** and **Skewsy Newsy** (Village Jasper).

There were 13 WA born horses who took home their first win bonuses (\$2,000 breeder and \$2,000 owner), ranging in age from 2yos to 5yos.

At metropolitan stakes meetings in March, there were 14 WA born horses who won 15 races, another good result. Congratulations to the breeders and connections of these Westbreds, including 2 listed under the Westsired and 4 in the fillies and mares section. The other 8 Westbred winners were:

- ♦ **Euphoric Moment (Mr Feelgood)** owner breeders S and C Glover, went straight to the lead, set fast quarters, held out the favourite and won the \$18,000 2YO Colts and Geldings Western Crown in 1:57.3;
- ♦ **Hot Fraternity (Art Major)** breeders Kath Rosher, A and A Sargent, P Jarvis, D Hindle, started from 9, restrained to last and then too strong in the finish to win by 1.8m in 1:56.6, last qtrs. 28.6 and 28.4;
- ♦ **Importer Exporter (Artesian)** breeder, trainer and part owner Chris Winston, outstanding drive by catch driver Colin Brown, started from 20m and settled midfield, before driving through near the finish to

win the \$50,000 Easter Cup on the line, rating 1:59 over the 2902m. Well deserved win and now has stakes over \$135,972;

- ◆ ***Its Rock And Roll (A Rocknroll Dance)*** breeder Ed Dewar, made it 2 wins from three starts when he stepped out and won the \$100,000 Sales Classic in a brilliant finish, running 1:56.6 over the 1730m;
- ◆ ***Jailbreak (Major In Art)*** owned trainer Peter Kimberley and bred by Peter, R and M Kimberley, settled on the rails midfield and got off at the right time to win an \$18,000 M0 moving away, mile rate 1:58.1;
- ◆ ***Khun Ratha (Bettors Delight)*** breeder Paul Poli, in good form for new trainer Josh Dunn with a good win in a 2536m M1-M3 in 1:57.8, and led and won a C5-C9 in 1:58.6, last qtrs. 28.8 and 27.7;
- ◆ ***Rock Me Over (Rock And Roll Heaven)*** breeder Mike Howie. Half brother to Derby winner Handsandwheels, after 4 placings in 5 starts fought out the finish and won the \$25,000 Colts and Geldings Sales Classic in 1:58.1; and
- ◆ ***Tommy Be Good (Jeremes Jet)*** breeder Patrician Park (John Coffey), excellent stand performer, started from 30m and perfectly driven to run down the race leader and win an \$18,000 M0+ stand.

At Bridgetown, trainer Justin Prentice **figured as the breeder of 4yo gelding Courage To Live (Courage Under Fire)** winner of the \$10,000 Bridgetown Cup.

Stakemoney earned by Westbreds finishing in the first 6 places in all races in March was \$1,052,633 (previous months \$873,873 in February 2018, \$753,534 in January, \$804,584 in December, \$663,004 in November, \$686,879 in October, \$585,293 in September). Total stakes paid to all Westbred starters was \$1,123,433 out of a total of \$2,263,180. In percentage terms this is a slightly better result than last month, which was a big improvement on the previous 4 months. All very pleasing.

For the period September to March 1342 races have been run compared to 1353 in 2016/17. Total stakes paid is \$16,070,240 compared to actual race stakes offered of \$16,244,400.

HOW DID THE FILLIES AND MARES GO (March 2018)



Fillies and mares won 27.7% (56 races) of the 202 races run in March, just one race less than February 2018.

This is a good result compared to March over the previous 5 years, with generally more races run in those months but only March 2016 (27.8% and 58 winners) exceeding this month's result, and by a very small margin.

Our aim is for the race program to consistently achieve 25% filly/mare winners per month in the short term, increasing to 30% (the national average) in the medium term. Recent results are pleasing, but if you have any issues with the race program for your fillies or mares, or have any ideas that might assist owners of fillies or mares, *please* let us know.

There were 21 F/M races run in March 2018, with an additional \$18,000 3yo Fillies race abandoned following a choking down incident with a lap to go. All fillies (and drivers) did get to the feet but unfortunately for connections there were some injuries.

Of the wins, 35 (17.3%) were open races and the remaining 21 (10.4%) races were restricted to fillies/mares.

Overall, there were 5 2yo wins (3 Westbred) and 13 3yo wins, with 5 of those wins in R class. All wins by 3yo fillies in 3yo races were Westbred fillies. There were another 9 R class winners, 18 in races restricted to C3 and/or lower and 7 were in FFA/M class. There was one 2yo filly and one 3yo filly collecting their first win bonus money (breeder \$2,000 and owner \$2,000).

All up, stakemoney earned by fillies and mares finishing in the first 6 places in all races in March 2018 was \$612,563 (\$459,568 in February, \$378,622 in January, \$593,689 in December, November \$372,691, October \$406,302, September \$321,004) with total stakes paid to all fillies and mares for all starters being \$646,903. The figure is the best monthly figure so far this season, with the percentage for dollars earned comparable to the percentage for number of wins. We are happy to see these numbers continue to improve, giving the connections of fillies and mares a better return.

The result wasn't quite as good as last month for the WA bred fillies, but they still won 62.5% of the races won by fillies and mares and 67.7% of total stakes won by fillies and mares.

In a bit of a low result at metro stakes meetings, 7 mares won 7 of the 47 (14.9%) races. Winners included **Madame Meilland** (McArdle) who won the \$50,000 Empress Stakes, and NZ mares **Covered N Diamonds** (American Ideal) - won a M0-M1 mile in a low flying 1:53.8 - and **Im Zuleika** (Courage Under Fire) won an M0.

Congratulations to the connections of all the fillies and mares who did win in March. The WA bred winners were:

- ♥ **Has No Fear (Western Terror)** breeders Kevin and Annette Charles, after a very good second in the \$100,000 WA Sales Classic the previous week this Trotsynd filly led, was challenged and won the \$18,000 2YO Fillies Western Crown by 4m in 1:58.4;
- ♥ **Lady De La Renta (Well Said)**, breeders Kevin, Annette and Kody Charles, unbackable in the \$25,000 3yo Fillies Sales Classic and won by 8.7m, after an excellent win at her previous start in an \$18,000 3yo fillies race, making it three metro stakes wins from 4 starts;
- ♥ **Rockin The Boys (Rock N Roll Heaven)**, bred, part owned and trained by Debra Lewis, after two previous seconds, settled third last with the leaders going hard, before moving to the breeze with 1000 to go, then ran away from them to win an \$18,000 Mares M0 by 12.8m in 1:58; and
- ♥ **Soho Interceptor (Art Major)**, owner breeder Robert Watson, beautifully bred filly who was driven well to miss the early interference, went to the lead and went to the line the best to win the 2yo Fillies \$100,000 Sales Classic in 1:57.6.

At Pinjarra it was the first Country Derby won by a filly in over a decade (the 2006 Country Derby was won by Dilingers Reign, following the 2005 win by filly Sovereign Beejay). Bred, part owned and trained by Terry Ferguson, Cimorene faced the breeze and held on to win the \$30,000 Country Derby over 2130m, running 1:57 for the journey. Top effort.

HARNES RACING COMMITTEE (HRC)

The final two positions on the HRC are being decided, as we write. Once the positions are filled we expect to be provided with much greater opportunities to make submissions to the HRC. If there are any matters you want us to consider for input to the Committee *PLEASE LET US KNOW*.

Our Vice President Howard King is the participant body member on the HRC. Issues or concerns you raise with WASBA are discussed by the WASBA Committee at our monthly meeting, which Howard attends. We are currently working through some items for submission, with better support for breeding and encouragement of ownership at the top of our list.

We are also working with Harness Racing Australia (HRA) on initiatives to support breeding.
