He stands for \$10,000 in the US, so this is a great opportunity.

Shadow Play won the Little Brown Jug in a 2 heat world record, Adios Pace in World Record and has also come into focus with the win by exciting 2yo **To Fast To Serious** in the Group 1 2yo Westbred Classic in June, making it 3 wins from 4 starts. Shadow Play is the sire of one of the leading 3yos in the US this year, is a multiple Group 1 sire in Australia and has over 50 3yo winners in Australasia including 8 under 1:55.

The raffle closes 20 August, allowing you to be ready for the start of the breeding season! Mares must be located in WA or SA at time of service to redeem a prize.

\$25,000 3yo Westsired and \$30,000 2yo Westsired

Some great racing in the Westsired Classics and some genuinely nice winners with bright prospects in their future careers. Congratulations to **Veiled Secret (Tinted Cloud** 3yo filly bred and owned by Allwood Stud), **Harry Haich** (3yo **Parsons Den** gelding bred by Ross Torre's Royalstar Farm) and 2yo **Babyface Adda (Rich And Spoilt** colt bred and owned by Harry Capararo).

Babyface led, Harry breezed and Veiled Secret flew from the clouds. Veiled Secret and Babyface Adda were homebreds, although Babyface Adda did go through the Sales ring and everyone missed an opportunity there. Harry Haich also went through the Sales ring, and was an astute purchase by Vicki Lea and Ron Huston for the bargain price of \$5,000, especially when you know how closely related he is to **James Matthew**.

All three winners are nicely bred youngsters, all by underrated sires, and all good winners no less.

Group 1 2018 \$100,000 Westbred Classics

Also terrific racing in the Westbred Classics. Four winners, four different breeders, owners, trainers and drivers.

No one dominated with the spoils being spread amongst 4 different breeders, owners and connections.

A seriously good field stepped out in the 3yo fillies and the speed was hot. Winner **Rosies Ideal (American Ideal)**, owned and bred by Craig and Allan Lynn, came five wide down the straight to win in 1:56.7. Rosie was also the Gold Bracelet winner from last year and recently returned to trainer Shane Young.

The 3yo boys also went super fast from the barrier, and race favourite **One Off Delight (Bettors Delight)** with the advantage of the inside running kept the lead from barrier to post. Bred and owned by stable clients of Gary Hall Snr, Gary is proud to say he bred and owned a Westbred Classic winner!

What a super field and super race for the 2yo colts and geldings. **Shadow Play** gelding **To Fast To Serious**, bred by Ed Dewar, won the start in another fast lead time. Going 27.9 down the back and 28.9 home made it very difficult for the classy field to run over him, but they gave it a go. He went on to win by 1.7m in 1:56 flat.

The 2yo fillies was equally exciting and a long wait on the protest result but in the end **Art Major** filly **Soho Interceptor** won on the line by a narrow margin then withstood a protest to be declared the winner after leading all the way. Bred and part owned by Robert Watson, the filly was also the winner of the \$100,000 Sales Classic in March before travelling to NSW for the APG final. Great training effort to get her back in her best form.

Don't forget that breeders of the Westbred Classic placegetters receive \$5000, \$3000 and \$2000 for first to third respectively.

The \$125,000 Golden Slipper

He isn't WA bred but he is owned by one of our prominent breeders in Robert Watson, and purchased from the 2017 NZ Premier Yearling Sale for \$17,500 by Kim Prentice on Robert's behalf. Racing near the rear, Franco Edward led up the three wide line with a lap to go and in a close finish won from the fast finishing Bletchley Park and Its Rock And Roll. He then withstood a protest to be declared the winner in a close-to race record of 1:56, last quarters 28.3 and 28.4.

Franco Edward is out of the unraced **Edinburgh Franco (Changeover)**, who is a half sister to **Eden Franco** 1:54.1 \$115,945 and **Franco Emirate** 1:53.8 \$332,830, both by Christian Cullen. The dam of Edinburgh Franco is **Elisit Franco (Falcon Seelster)** 1:57.1, the half sister to **Franco Enforce (OK Bye)** 1:50.6 \$593,738 and to

the granddam of **Artemis Belle (Artiscape)** 1:56.1 \$359,559 and **Eagle Rox (Bettors Delight)** 1:55.2 \$225,656. Plenty of WA links here.

Franco Edward also won the \$100,000 Pearl Classic, and had won 2 out of three before going into the Pearl, including a 1:54.2 at Pinjarra. WASBA doesn't encourage 2yos scooting around at breakneck speed, but if they do it's certainly noteworthy.

NO CHANGE TO THE WESTBRED BONUS, FIRST WIN BONUS OR EPONA

Just repeating, that for the coming season there are no changes to the Westbred Bonus or Epona Schemes and all Westbred foals born this coming season (2018/19) and in 2019/20 (from mares served in this coming season) are eligible for all the same great bonuses as they currently are. All mares winning races in WA will also receive the same Epona benefits.

The new handicapping system will have no adverse affect on these bonuses. Westbred only races, and fillies and mares races, will still be programmed as they currently are, with the new handicapping system simply changing from a R, C and M class system to a win only ratings system. While the new handicapping system is yet to be finalised and implemented, this is expected to occur during the first few months of the 2018/19 season.

NOTE THE CHANGES TO THE BREEDERS CROWN HEAT SYSTEM

As mentioned last year, there ARE changes to the Breeders Crown Heat system – THERE WILL NOT BE ANY HEATS RUN IN WA IN 2018/19. You will have to travel east with your horse if you want to be eligible for the Breeders Crown being run in the 2018/19 season. If you have no intention of travelling, or have no intention of selling your current yearling/weanling or 2018/19 foal, we suggest you assess whether it's worthwhile to pay up.

Please pay your membership. BREEDER OF THE MONTH – MAY 2018

The Breeder of the Month award goes to a different WA bred horse each month. Previous winners are not eligible for later awards. The Award is the only Breeding Award provided by WASBA that is restricted to WASBA members.

It was a difficult month again, even with some previous winners ruling themselves out of contention. The winner this month is a very worthy winner, in fact a dual winner. **Congratulations** to our **Breeder of the Month for May, Bob Fowler's Allwood Stud Farm** for breeding 4yo gelding **Lord Willoughby (Mach Three** out of Amongst Royalty by **Parsons Den**).

Lord Willoughby has been in terrific form this season since resuming in December 2017 after four months out of racing. In May he won consecutive races a fortnight apart, making it 8 wins and 11 places from 21 starts in the season to the end of May.

The first win in May was in an \$18,000 M0 where he started favourite and breezed to win in 1:57.8, last qtrs. 27.7 and 29. The second win was in a 2503 \$18,000 M0 and better stand. He got away well and again led, and held off stand star Tommy Be Good in the run home to win by 1.8m with a further 11m to third. The mile rate was 1:58.5 and last half was 56.3.

Lord Willoughby is a half brother to **Lady Willoughby (Allamerican Ingot)** 1:56.6 \$167,293. Their dam is the Royalstar Farm bred **Amongst Royalty (Parsons Den)** 1:55.1 23 wins \$570,820, one of WA's best performed race mares with wins in the Group 1 Bathurst Gold Tiara 2 yr old Fillies Final, Australian Pacing Gold 2 yr Fillies Final, 2008 and 2009 Pinjarra Golden Girls Mile and the 2010 Australian Pacing Championship Consolation. Amongst Royalty is a half sister to **Chazsalico (Prince Of Gold)** 1:57 \$141,515 and full sister to **Made Of Dreams** 10 wins \$39,664 and dam of Group 1 winner **Straittotheilton (Rich And Spoilt)** 1:56 and \$157,415.

The dam of Amongst Royalty is the unraced **Arctic Glow (Northern Lights)** who produced four other winners and is out of **Broncroft Castle (J R Skipper)**, the dam of eight winners including **Mon Poppy Day (Whats Next)** 1:56.4 20 wins \$318,558 and WA Oaks and 2yo Classic winner **Parthenon (Golden Greek)** 2:00 \$79,920. Broncroft Castle is a half sister to **Vain Franco (Holmes Hanover)** the dam of **Under Cover Lover (In The Pocket)** 1:51.8 21 wins \$864,923, **Ccs Lover (Christian Cullen)** 1:51.2 51 wins \$324,694 wins, **Cybersleuth (In The Pocket)** 1:52 30 wins \$195,071 and **Front Cover Lover (Whats Next)** the dam of **Bettor Cover Lover (Bettors Delight)** 1:53.8 19 wins \$1,026,427.

Congratulations Bob Fowler and Lord Willoughby.

WA BASED SIRES – MAY 2018

In May 2018, the progeny of 11 WA based sires produced 21 individual winners of 24 races. Allamerican Ingot and Rich And Spoilt both produced 4 individual winners of five races.

The dual winners for the month were **Natural Temptation** (Allamerican Ingot), **Infinite Symbol** (Indomitable Saab) and **Adda Shooting Star** (Rich And Spoilt).

There were no Westsired winners at Gloucester Park metropolitan stakes meetings in May, although the \$150,000 WA Oaks produced a third (Cott Beach) and fourth (Infinite Symbol) placed Westsired filly.

WESTBRED WINNERS – MAY 2018



Westbreds won 98 (52.1%) of the 188 races run in May 2018. This is very pleasing after a dip in April. It's also higher than May 2017 in both number (97) and percentage (51.1%) terms.

There were 21 Westbred races run in May 2018, down on the figure for each of the last three months. However, this is balanced by the higher win tally, which this month is greater than our target of 50% winners. Our aim is to regularly achieve a 50% win target and an improved percentage of total stakes. We continue to work towards achieving this.

Of the sires based outside WA, **Bettors Delight** did best with 10 winners of 11 races followed by **Art Major** with 7 winners of 8 races. Mach Three was next with 4 winners of 5 races, with Shadow Play, Somebeachsomewhere and Village Jasper all producing 4 winners of 4 races.

There were 5 multiple winners for the month from sires based outside of WA. Dual winners were **Slick Artist** (Art Major), **Eagle Rox** (Bettors Delight), **Lord Willoughby** (Mach Three) and **Tyler Brett** (Robin Hood). **Daniel John** (Blissfull Hall) won three races in the month including two at Kellerberrin and one at Wagin.

There were 12 WA born horses who took home their first win bonuses (\$2,000 breeder and \$2,000 owner).

There were 11 WA born horses who won 12 races at metropolitan stakes meetings in May. Congratulations to the breeders and connections of these Westbreds, including 3 listed under the fillies and mares section. The other 8 Westbred winners were:

- ◆ **Bettor Be Lively (Bettors Delight)** breeder Craig Lynn, the 2017 Country Derby winner has really hit his straps under his new team, leading and winning a C5 to C9 Westbred by 2.3m, 3rd qtr 27.7;
- ◆ **Kasey John (Bettors Delight)** breeder and part owner Steve Johnson, after a run of outs led and won an \$18,000 M0 by 1.9m, last quarters 28.3 and 28.9;

- ◆ **Lord Willoughby (Mach Three)** owner breeder Allwood Stud Farm, won an \$18,000 M0 and followed up a fortnight later with a win in an \$18,000 M1 and better stand, last qtrs 28.2 and 28.1;
- ◆ **Major Survivor (Art Major)**, breeder owners D Roberts, B Anderson, S Beven, N Champion, J Farrell, half brother to Sensational Gabby, stepped out in his 3rd race start and ran them off their feet to win by 3.2m in 1:55.2, last qtrs 27.7 and 28.5;
- ◆ **Mister Versace (Bettors Delight)**, breeders Ed Dewar, C Plabou, W Grimm, after a win the previous month, wisely conceded the lead before going three wide out of the back straight to finish fast and win Heat 3 of the Pure Steel by 2m in 1:56.5, last qtrs 28.3 and 28.1;
- ◆ **One Off Delight (Bettors Delight)** breeders Gary Hall Snr stable clients Phil and L Turner, G and T Ralston, led and won his 4th race for the season, running last qtrs of 27.7 and 28.2 to win the \$18,000 3yo Pace by 5.8m in a lifetime best of 1:56.4;
- ◆ **Our Zak Whitby (Mach Three)** breeder and part owner Ed Dewar, won a \$22,000 M1 to M3 1730m flyer in a lifetime best of 1:53.3, last qtrs 28.1 and 27.1, and
- ◆ **Vultan Tin (Dawn Ofa New Day)**, owner breeders Phil and Denise Costello and trained by Phil, after an open class win in April, and in atrocious conditions, burned out from barrier 3 to lead and win the \$25,000 Members Sprint by 2.7m in a super 1:55.5.

In the country, 2yo colt **Back In Twenty (Sportswriter)**, owned and bred by Allwood Stud Farm, put up a good performance to win the \$10,000 De Campo Memorial at Bunbury by 7.8m in 1:56.5. last half 56.2.

Stakemoney earned by Westbreds finishing in the first 6 places in all races in May was \$749,409. Total stakes earned by Westbreds was \$810,329, or 42.6% of total stakes paid of \$1,903,250. This is slightly better than April. As a general principle, we would like to achieve 45-50% per month on a regular basis.

For the period September to May, 1722 races have been run compared to 1728 in 2016/17. Total stakes paid to the end of May is \$19,888,400 compared to actual race stakes of \$20,080,900.

HOW DID THE FILLIES AND MARES GO (May 2018)



Fillies and mares won 28.7% (54 races) of the 188 races run in May 2018.

This is the sixth successive month where there has been over 50 winners in a month and over 25% winners in the month. It is higher than the figures for May over the last two years but not as high as the bumper month in 2015 when there was 63 F/M winners of 32% of the races.

We are looking for the current trend to continue to, in the medium term, achieve 30% filly/mare winners per month. This is not an unreasonable target given that 50% of foals are fillies and mares and there owners need to have good racing opportunities. It is therefore critical that the number of fillies and mares races are continually monitored to ensure the opportunities exist. Our peak year for the number of races won by fillies and mares was 2015/16, which is also the year that we had the most races for fillies and mares.

Of the wins, 31 (16.5%) were open races and the remaining 23 (12.2%) races were restricted to fillies/mares. More fillies mares races were scheduled, but some classes have not been popular.

Overall, there were 5 2yo filly winners in 2yo races (4 Westbred) and one in an R0. There were 18 races won by 3yo fillies - 7 3yo wins (3 Westbred), 8 C class wins and 3 R class wins. 2yo and 3yo wins in C or R class do not attract the Westbred Bonus.

For the mares there were 7 R class wins, 9 in classes that were C3 or lower and 5 in FFA/M class. There were additionally 2 races for the Westbred 4 and 5yo mares. There were 3 2yo fillies, one 3yo filly and 2 mares taking home their first win bonuses (breeder \$2,000 and owner \$2,000).

Westbred fillies and mares won 74.1% of the races won by fillies and mares and 51.5% of the stakes. All up, stakemoney earned by fillies and mares finishing in the first 6 places in all races in May was \$577,849, with total stakes paid to all fillies and mares for all starters being \$618,619 or 32.5% of total stakes paid.

We would like to see the earnings for fillies and mares, and Westbred fillies and mares, in proportion to the win percentages, indicating that the wins are across all classes.

If you have any ideas concerning the race program for your fillies or mares, or have any ideas that might assist owners of fillies or mares, *please* let us know.

At metro stakes meetings, 8 mares won 8 of the 40 (20.0%) races, including three feature races. Winners included **Eden Franco (Christian Cullen)** who won the \$25,000 M0 and better Laurie Kennedy Race For Roses stand, 3yo filly **Our Major Mama (Art Major)** thrilled her connections to win the \$150,000 WA Oaks, **She Could Be Good (Well Said)** won a reduced stakes M0 to M2 mares, **Maczaffair (Mach Three)** was scintillating winning the \$50,000 WASBA Breeders Stakes, and **Major Reality (Art Major)** won an \$18,000 M0+ Mares. The \$10,000 De Campo Memorial at Bunbury for the 2yo fillies was won by NZ filly Dracarys.

Congratulations to the connections of all the fillies and mares who won in May. The WA bred GP winners were:

- ♥ **Eagle Rox (Bettors Delight)** breeder owner trainer Debra Lewis, won a midweek GP C2 to C6 after two and a half years away from the track, then 17 days later led up the three wide line with a lap to go and won an \$22,000 open M1 to M3 in 1:57.8, last half 55.7;
- ♥ **Gotta Go Gabbana (Gotta Go Collect)**, owner breeders Annie and Colin Belton, worked overtime to retain the lead and went on to win the C5 to C9 Westbred by 4m in 1:57.1, last qtrs. 28.4; and
- ♥ **Lady De La Renta (Well Said)**, breeders Kevin, Annette and Kody Charles, worked hard early to get the lead, skipped away on the turn and went on to win the inaugural Group 2 \$50,000 3yo Fillies Diamond Classic by 8.8m in 1:56.3, last qtrs 28.3 and 28.8.

All quality fillies and mares and if we can provide the opportunities for them to continue racing in WA we (and they) should have a bright future.
