## **MATERNITY ASSISTANCE FOR DRIVERS AND JOCKEYS**

RWWA have announced a new Maternity Assistance Program to provide financial support to female drivers and jockeys during their pregnancy.

From 1 January 2020 changes made to the Federal legislation will mean that drivers and jockeys will become eligible for the Federal Government's Parental Leave provisions, from the time the child is born. RWWA's Maternity Assistance Program will bridge the gap by providing financial support to drivers and jockeys from the time they are required to cease driving or riding until they are eligible for the Federal Government's scheme.

While changes to the legislation are the initiative of the Federal Government, the decision by RWWA to bridge the gap between ceasing driving/riding and the birth is a great result for female drivers/riders and their partners.

## ***HRA TRADING RING***

Many of you would be aware that HRA made the controversial decision to dispense with the Trading Ring, the free forum on the HRA website that allowed you to advertise your excess stock in a simple format, with no associated cost.

Many in the industry across Australia considered this to be a decision detrimental to the interests of good management of harness racing in Australia, and there is general disappointment with the actions of HRA administrators in this regard. All states have had to make a financial contribution to keep the national system RISE running and should have had a say in this.

To their credit, RWWA have indicated that they will be developing a similar concept to the Trading Ring, to assist owners, trainers, breeders and others with advertising or seeking out horses, whether it be for racing, breeding or rehoming. This will at least assist those WA participants who were regular users of the Trading Ring.

As soon as we have more details we will let you know.

## ***Harness Ladies of Racing Awards***

The Thoroughbred Ladies of Racing Award winners have recently been announced. In even better news, there will be a Ladies of Racing Awards for harness, with the inaugural awards to be held in January.

## 2019 WASBA Bob Humphries Memorial

Another excellent night of racing at Bunbury this year, for the 7<sup>th</sup> running of the WASBA Bob Humphries Memorial. Special thanks to Bunbury and Julie Doble and staff for putting such an effort into marketing harness racing at Bunbury

A very well matched field as well, with many chances. Favourite La Roue De Lamour went to the lead from her barrier 3, with well supported Tiffany Twirl going to the breeze. In the back straight the last time the in form 4yo mare **Radiant Amber (Betterthancheddar** out of Elsu Sheila by **Elsu**), with 3 wins from her previous 5 starts, made a sweeping move three wide to be 3<sup>rd</sup> at the 400. Hitting the front as she rounded the home turn, Radiant Amber pulled away to go on and win the Bob Humphries Memorial by 6m from Delightful Mandy, who had sat behind the winner most of the way but couldn't quite match her in the finishing stages. Bred by P and M O'Neill, owned by Tiffany Sharpe and trained by Ryan Bell, it was a perfect drive on Radiant Amber by Aiden De Campo to win the bikkies. The mile rate was 1:57.7 and last qtr 27.8. No wonder it was difficult to make ground!

Radiant Amber is the first foal from her race winning dam **Elsu Sheila (Elsu)** 1:55.8, 9 wins 15 places \$67,458. Elsu Sheila is a half sister to **Emcil (Miles McCool)** 2:10.4, who is the dam of 3 winners including **San Fran Lady (Live Or Die)** 1:52.0, 32 wins \$233,017. The unraced **Noras Lilly (Mark Lobell)**, the dam of Elsu Sheila, is a half sister to **Janet Blue Chip (Smooth Fella)** the dam of multiple Group 1 winner **Jack Cade (Il Vicolo)** 1:56.5 16 wins \$729,643. Noras Lilly is also a half sister to the granddam of multiple Group winner **Berisari (Safari)** 1:52.0, 20 wins and \$363,591.

## RECENT MEMORABLE MOMENTS

- ♣ After a 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 4YO Championship, great first past the post by **Shockwave** in the \$125,000 4YO Classic, with winner of the 4YO Championship, Theo Aviator, coming in 3<sup>rd</sup>. Both WA bred, one Westbred and one Westsired.
- ♣ Renaissance Man 4yo **Ourboybart** and Advance Attack 4yo **Highly Flammable** the winners of the first of the \$10,000 Westbred races introduced this year for the 4YO and over
- ♣ Another great win by **Handsandwheels**, this time in the \$50,000 Bunbury Cup, with evergreen 8yo Vultan Tin coming 3<sup>rd</sup>;

## BREEDER OF THE MONTH - OCTOBER 2019

The Breeder of the Month award goes to a different WA bred horse each month. Previous (horse) winners are not eligible for later WA Breeder of the Month awards. You must be a WASBA member to win a Breeder of the Month Award. All other breeding awards are open to all WA breeders.

**Congratulations** to our **Breeder of the Month** for **October**, Kath Rosher, A and A Sargent, P Jarvis, D Hindle, the breeders of 8yo gelding **Hot Fraternity (Art Major** out of Red Hot Date by **Village Jasper**). In fact, Kath and crew bred two horses on the list, with 9yo gelding Bettor Go Boom (Bettors Delight out of Boom Or Bust by Kawartha Robust) winning his first race (on the same night as 10yo mare Disco Flash won her first race!). Bettor Go Boom resumed racing in 2019 after nearly 4 years absence.

Kath, Sean Sargent and others race Hot Fraternity, who resumed racing in August after his previous race start in May 2018. He started second favourite when initially leading then conceded the lead before going on to grab the win by a half head in an \$18,000 Pace, lifetime best 1:55.9, last half 57.9. A 3<sup>rd</sup> followed a fortnight later, then 3 weeks later in October, went straight to the front, a 28.0 and 28.1 final qtrs and they couldn't catch him, winning by 2.3m in 1:57.6, taking his career stakes to \$110,793 from 11 wins and 23 places from only 60 lifetime starts.



Hot Fraternity winning in October

Hot Fraternity is the highest stakes earner from the 4 winners produced by top race mare and 2007 WASBA Breeders Stakes winner **Red Hot Date** 1:56.5 12 wins \$99,730. Her dam **Boom Or Bust (Kawartha Robust)** 2:03 \$35,997 is an exceptional broodmare, producing 8 winners including Red Hot Date, **Hello Boys (Crouch)** 12 wins 17 places and \$89,541, **Party Date (Panorama)** 1:56, 25 wins and \$256,003, her last foal Bettor Go Boom 1:59.5 2 wins \$19,562 and 4 other winners. Hello Boys is the dam of **Kiss Chasey (Yankee Sensation)** 1:55.3 16 wins \$146,358, Group 1 winner **Play The Boys (Shadow Play)** 1:56.2 \$78,233 and granddam of **Rockin The Boys (Rock N Roll Heaven)** 1:51.2 14 wins \$125,567. Party Date is the dam of **Bettor Party (Bettors Delight)** 1:53.5 38 wins \$313,802 **Rocknroll Whitby (Rocknroll Hanover)** 1:57.2 12 wins \$151,100 and 5 other winners. Boom Or Bust is a winning half sister to 6 other winners, and is out of Boom Boom Baby (Pure Steel) who in turn is a half sister to Dripping Diamonds (Maple Lanes Strike) the dam of Golden Goddess (Golden Greek) 1:56.9 29 wins \$258,906 and Golden Gears (Golden Greek) 1:56.9 25 wins \$336,466. This is just a few of the winners from this family.

Congratulations to very patient breeder and part owner Kath Rosher, the Sargents and others, and **Hot Fraternity**.

## ***WA BASED SIRES – OCTOBER 2019***

October 2019 produced 14 Westsired winners of 15 races, from 8 different WA sires. **Advance Attack** and **Rich And Spoilt** both had winners of 4 races each.

The dual winner for the month was **Adda Pocket Rinse (Rich And Spoilt)** who not only won his first ever race (earning his \$2000 breeder and \$2000 owner bonuses) but also, on his next win, earned the double Westsired Bonus in a 3yo race. An extra \$10,000 for the month!!

All up there were 4 first time Westsired winners in October – congratulations to Adda Pocket Rinse, 5yo **Lavinjane** (Advance Attack), 4yo **Play Date** (Advance Attack) and 5yo **Hurricanetom** (Fully Loaded).

## ***WESTBRED WINNERS – OCTOBER 2019***

Another first, with the first October results under HWOE, with HWOE commencing mid November 2018.

There were 72 (47.7%) Westbred winners of the 151 races run in October 2019. This is a slight improvement on September 2019 in percentage terms. Compared to October 2018 it is 8% higher, with 27 less races run this year compared to last year.

There were 6 Westbred races run in October. We are not quite producing sufficient Westbred winners and will look to request increased Westbred only races should this continue. However, December will see the new \$10,000 only Westbred races which will be a welcome fillip to those Westbreds eligible. Keep your eye out for these races!

Again, we can best represent your interests if we are aware of any difficulties you are having in best placing your Westbred or mares in races, so please let us know. 50% Westbred winners and stakes is our target.

The progeny of 30 sires bases outside WA were represented by winners this month. Leading the way, in a very widespread month, was **Art Major** with 5 winners of 6 races, **Alta Christiano** and **Shadow Play** with 3 winners of 4 races and **Betterthanceddar** 2 winners of 4 races.

There were 9 multiple winners this month including one Westsired winner. **The Verandah** (Alta Christiano) repeated last month's effort with another 2 wins, **Major Pocket** (Art Major), **Bettor Go Boom** (Bettors Delight), **Batavia On Fire** (Courage Under Fire), **Machlani** (Mach Three), **Secret Operation** (Shadow Play) and **Raging Romeo** (Western Terror). There was one triple winner this month – and by the same sire as the triple winner last month, **Radiant Amber (Betterthanceddar)**

There were 11 (7 Westbred and 4 Westsired) first time winners in October taking home their \$2,000 owner and \$2,000 breeder first win bonus, compared to 15 in September 2019 and 10 in October 2018.

There were 27 less races run in October this year compared to 2018, which means all the number comparisons would be expected to be lower than the same month last year. Nevertheless the Westbred Bonus payments were higher, with \$12,656 paid in Westbred Bonuses (plus the first win bonuses) compared to \$5,100 in September 2019 and \$1,150 in October last year.

Four 3YO races, including 1 for Westbred only, were run in October. This is the same as last month, and one more than in October 2018.

Two of the 3YO races were won by Westbreds, with another 12 races won (including 5 races by 4 Westbreds) by 3yos in 3YO and over races. Four of the Westbred 3YO winners took home their first win Bonuses, with 3 of these in 3YO and over races.

15 of the wins by Westbreds were in \$4,500 races, 43 in \$7,500 races, 7 in Metro stakes races and the remainder were for stakes of \$9,000 to \$10,500.

At Gloucester Park, one meeting was abandoned, leaving only 30 races run at the Friday night prime meetings. There was some first class racing, with races hard to win so a quiet month overall. There were however 6 Westbred winners of 7 races at these meetings. Congratulations to the breeders and connections of the Westbreds who were successful at our feature race meetings in October.

The 6 WA born horses, including two from last month, are listed below:

- ◆ **Argyle Red (Dawn Ofa New Day)**, breeder owners Robert and Ann MacDonald, after a good win at his second run back from a 4 month absence, ran a brilliant little race from the front, fought back when challenged and won his second Group 2 \$50,000 Sprint over 1730m, this time in the Mount Eden Sprint in a lifetime best 1:53.8, last qtrs 27.6 and 28.5;
- ◆ **Batavia On Fire (Courage Under Fire)**, breeder Ted O Connor, took a moment to balance in the short course stand before shooting forward to take the lead, full of running in the back straight then scooted clear to go on and win the \$18,000 2096m stand by 10.1m in 2:00.2, last qtrs. 28.9 and 28.3;
- ◆ **Destined To Rule (Shadow Play)**, breeder Steve Johnson, 8 places from his previous 11 starts, well driven in a keenly contested 2503m stand, stayed out of trouble in the lead before handing up, then came off the rails at the right time to hit the lead in the straight and go on to win the \$18,000 Pace in 2:00.9, last qtrs 28.2 and 29.3;
- ◆ **Hot Fraternity (Art Major)** breeders P Jarvis, D Hindle with breeder/ part owners Kath Rosher, A and A Sargent, followed a win and a 3rd in September with a good start over the 2130m to go straight to the front, a steady as she goes first half before a catch me if you can 56.1 last half to win the \$20,000 Pace by 2.3m in 1:57.6;
- ◆ **Major Pocket (Art Major)** breeder part owner Oz-West Pacing, resumed in July after a short let up, ran 8 places out of 10 starts before going to the lead and untroubled to win an \$18,000 1730m Pace by 5.4m in a lifetime best of 1:52.6, last qtr 27.4, then a fortnight later had to sit in the breeze but still good enough to win a 2130m \$20,000 Pace in 1:55.7; and
- ◆ **Our Perkins (Rocknroll Hanover)**, breeder Steve Johnson, a good mid-week win at his previous start then fast out from barrier 1 and going straight to the front, withstood a challenge and went on to win an \$18,000 Pace over 2130m in 1:57.1, last qtrs 27.8 and 29.

Stakemoney earned by Westbreds finishing in the first 6 places in all races in October 2019 was \$634,081 (\$638,236 in September), which encouragingly is up on October last year when there were 27 additional races run. Total stakes paid to Westbreds was \$669,306, out of \$1,454,980 paid (advertised stakes of \$1,477,500 for the races that were run), or 43.6% of stakes compared to 36.7% in October last year.

Lining up all the comparisons, Westbreds provided 57.2% of individual race starters, 60.3% of race starts, 47.7% race winners and won 43.6% of race stakes. Compared to October last year, this is a higher percentage of race wins, a higher percentage of race stakes, so certainly in the right direction. However our target remains at 50% of wins and stakes in the medium term, as fair reward for breeders who take many risks to produce the racing stock.

## ***HOW DID THE FILLIES AND MARES GO (October 2019)***

Fillies and mares won 40 (26.5%) of the 151 races run in October 2019. This is two races more than September, which doesn't seem a lot but it is important to maintain the percentage of winners regardless of the

number of races, so it is a welcome slightly upward swing from September. In percentage terms it is the second highest October figure, with only October 2018 (27.0% of 178 races) being higher.

Of the wins by fillies and mares 19 (12.6%) were open races and the remaining 21 races (13.9%) were restricted to fillies and mares. There were 6 wins by 3yo fillies, all in 3YO and over races. There were 11 wins by 4yo mares, 12 by 5yos and the remaining 11 wins were by mares aged 6 to 9 years.

\$7,500 races accounted for 24 of the wins. Another 3 wins were metropolitan stakes races and 9 were in \$4,500 races, a big increase on last month.

Westbred fillies and mares won 25 (62.5%) of the 40 races won by fillies and mares and 59.5% of their stakes, an improvement over the previous month. As for the September figures, it is 9% higher than the same month last year.

Stakemoney earned by fillies and mares finishing in the first 6 places in October 2019 races was \$334,910, up \$24,000 on last month. Total stakes paid to fillies/mares was \$349,815. Both of these figures are lower than October 2018, which had 27 more races and would be expected to produce the higher return.

The percentage of October 2019 race stakes paid to fillies and mares was up from last month to 24.0%.

The September to November period does offer opportunity for earning, even if your mare is retiring to stud. She can comfortably race in the early stages of pregnancy with good management and training, so please keep this in mind when considering a stud career for your mare. A capable trainer should be able to assist in this process.

Fillies and mares comprised 29.3% of the race starts in October, and 27.2% of individual starters, both figures higher than September. For fillies and mares only, Westbred fillies and mares provided 75.0% of race starts and 70.9% of individual starters, similar to the previous two months.

We would like to be able to lift individual starters for fillies and mares to at least 35% on a monthly basis, with 50% of foals born being female. Our target for winners is 27% in the short term, heading towards 30% in the medium term and on an ongoing basis. We are certainly encouraging the harness office to provide as many opportunities for fillies and mares as owners require, which will allow more racing product and support the need to increase turnover on harness. If you are looking for opportunities for your filly or mare and cant find the right ones, please get in touch with us so that we can discuss with RWWA. Everyone is keen to see more horses available for racing, and not necessarily more horses racing more often.

There were 3 mares winning 3 of the 30 (10.0%) races at Gloucester Park metropolitan meetings in October, well short of our target of 25-30%.

Winners included classy NZ 7yo mare **Just Rockon Bye (Christian Cullen)** who has won 3 months in a row and 4 wins altogether, with a win in a \$22,000 Fillies and Mares. Four year old mare **Arma Indie (Well Said)** also made it two months in a row, following her win last month in a \$20,000 Fillies and Mares with a win in a \$20,000 Fillies and Mares, and 5yo mare **Our Alfie Romeo (Washington VC)** won a \$22,000 Fillies and Mares FFA.

Congratulations to the connections of all the fillies and mares who won in October.
